# **ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS**

RAYMOND L. DIRKS AND JOHN D. SULLIVAN SANCTIONED

U.S. SECURITIES AND

Administrative Law Judge Irving Schiller filed an initial decision barring COMMISSION L. Dirks and John D. Sullivan from association with any broker or dealer in a supervisory, managerial, financial, principal or proprietory capacity. Dirks and Sullivan were general partners in John Muir and Company, a registered broker-dealer.

In his decision, the Judge held that Dirks and Sullivan wilfully aided and abetted Muir's violation of the net capital requirements of the Securities Exchange Act. The decision further states that Dirks and Sullivan were responsible for the management and policies of Muir and as a result of the manner in which they conducted the financial affairs of Muir, the firm's customers were placed in an endangered position. The irresponsible conduct of Dirks and Sullivan was also found to have been the primary cause of the liquidation of the firm by a trustee appointed by a U.S. District Court under the Securities Investor Protection Act of 1970.

Based upon such findings and other matters considered in the decision, it was concluded that the sanctions imposed are in the public interest. The decision is subject to review by the Commission on its own motion or on petition of the parties.

#### CARLTON R. JORGENSEN BARRED

The Commission instituted public proceedings under Sections 15(b) and 19(h) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 against Carlton R. Jorgensen and Stifel, Nicolaus & Co. Incorporated, a broker-dealer registered with the Commission. In anticipation of these proceedings, Jorgensen and Stifel submitted Offers of Settlement which the Commission accepted.

Without admitting or denying the allegations contained in the Commission's Order for Public Proceedings: Jorgensen, in his Offer of Settlement, consented to a Commission Order providing for findings that he wilfully violated the antifraud provisions of the securities laws by executing unauthorized transactions in and converting funds from some of his customers' accounts while employed by Stifel and another brokerdealer; and Stifel, in its Offer of Settlement, consented to a Commission Order providing for findings that it failed to reasonably supervise Jorgensen.

In accepting Jorgensen's and Stifel's Offer of Settlement, the Commission barred Jorgensen from association with any broker, dealer, municipal securities dealer, investment company or investment adviser, and censured Stifel and required it to comply with certain undertakings. (Rel. 34-20473)

# CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

ORDER OF ARREST OF JOHN ACORD ENTERED

The Atlanta Regional Office and the Miami Branch Office announced that on December 6, following a hearing, Judge William M. Hoeveler, U.S. District Court for the Southern District of Florida, entered an Order of Arrest of John Acord. The Court found that John Acord, also known as John Allen (Acord), failed to comply with the Court's previous orders. The Order directed any U.S. Marshall to take Acord into custody and bring him before the Court for further Order. Acord's present residence is unknown.

On November 8 the Commission filed a Motion for an Order to Show Cause and an Order Directing That John Acord Be Imprisoned for failing to comply with the Judgment of Civil Contempt And Order To Pay Against John Acord entered on August 23. In that judgment the Court found Acord in civil contempt for violating a temporary restraining order entered on December 22, 1982 and ordered him to pay to the court appointed receiver, the sum of \$299,250 within 15 days of the entry of the judgment. The judgment also provided that Acord shall be fined \$500 per day after the 15th day until he pays the full amount to the receiver. Acord has not paid the money to the receiver, and has violated the temporary restraining order by removing \$299,250 from a Monarch Oil & Gas Limited bank account that was frozen by that order. (SEC v. Monarch Oil & Gas Corporation, et al., SD FL, Civil Action No. 82-6833-CIV-WMH). (LR-10235)

#### SPARBANKERNAS BANK

An order has been issued amending a 1980 order to extend the exemption granted to Sparbankernas Bank, a Swedish commercial bank, to include a wholly-owned domestic finance subsidiary, Swedbank, Inc. (Rel. IC-13678 - Dec. 20)

#### EZI FINANCE LTD.

An order has been issued exempting EZI Finance Ltd., an Australian corporation, from all provisions of the Investment Company Act. (Rel. IC-13679 - Dec. 20)

### HUTTON TELEPHONE & TELECOMMUNICATIONS TAX-ADVANTAGED TRUST

An order has been issued exempting Hutton Telephone & Telecommunications Tax-Advantaged Trust, an open-end, non-diversified, management investment company, from the provisions of Sections 2(a)(32), 2(a)(35), 22(c) and 22(d) of the Investment Company Act and Rule 22c-1. This will permit Hutton to assess a contingent deferred sales charge on redemptions of its initial and future series of shares and to waive the contingent sales charge on redemptions following the death, disability, or retirement of a shareholder. (Rel. IC-13680 - Dec. 20)

### NATIONAL GOVERNMENT RESERVES, INC.

An order has been issued declaring that National Government Reserves, Inc. has ceased to be an investment company. (Rel. IC-13681 - Dec. 20)

#### MASTER RESERVES TAX FREE TRUST

An order has been issued exempting Capital T Tax Free Fund and Master Reserves Tax Free Trust from the provisions of Section 12(d)(3) of the Investment Company Act to enable them to acquire rights to sell their portfolio securities to brokers or dealers. (Rel. IC-13682 - Dec. 20)

#### HOMAC GOVERNMENT FINANCIAL CORPORATION WEST

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until January 16, 1984 to request a hearing on an application filed by HOMAC Government Financial Corporation West, a limited purpose financing corporation, for an order exempting it from all provisions of the Investment Company Act. (Rel. IC-13683 - Dec. 20)

#### CENTRAL POWER AND LIGHT COMPANY

### PUBLIC SERVICE COMPANY OF OKLAHOMA

### CONSOLIDATED NATURAL GAS COMPANY

A supplemental notice has been issued giving interested persons until January 16, 1984 to request a hearing on a proposal by Consolidated Natural Gas Company, a registered holding company, two of its subsidiaries, Consolidated Gas Supply Corporation and CNG Coal Company, and Consolidated Gas Transmission Corporation, a newly-organized corporation, regarding the reorganization of the system's operations in West Virginia. # SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

AMENDMENT NO. 1 TO PROPOSED RULE CHANGE AND ACCELERATED APPROVAL

The Commission approved an amended proposed rule change, on an accelerated basis, filed under Rule 19b-4 by the <a href="Philadelphia Stock Exchange">Philadelphia Stock Exchange</a>, Inc. The rule change (SR-Phlx-83-16) permits the use of letters of credit as "original" or initial margin when establishing short positions in foreign currency options. (Rel. 34-20497)

### APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The Commission approved proposed rule changes filed under Rule 19b-4 by the American Stock Exchange, Inc. One rule change (SR-Amex-83-26) enables the order of a registered options trader to retain priority over or have parity with an off-floor broker-dealer order represented in the trading crowd, where both orders are to establish or increase a position. (Rel. 34-20502) The other (SR-Amex-83-30) increases position and exercise limits for Amex's Treasury bill options. (Rel. 34-20506)

## TRUST INDENTURE ACT RELEASES

#### THE STANDARD OIL COMPANY
