## NOTICE OF COMMISSION MEETINGS

U.S. SECORITIES AND EXCHANCE COMMISSION

Following is a schedule of Commission meetings which will be conducted pursuant to provisions of the Government in the Sunshine Act. In general, the Commission expects to follow a schedule of holding closed meetings on Tuesdays, and open meetings on Thursday morning. Meetings on Wednesday, and if necessary on Thursday afternoons, will be either open or closed according to the requirements of agenda items under consideration. The Commission will not normally meet on Mondays or Fridays.

Visitors are welcome at all open meetings, insofar as space is available.

Meetings will be held in the Commission Meeting Room, Room 1C30, at the Commission's headquarters building, 450 Fifth Street, N.W., Washington, DC. Persons wishing to photograph or videotape Commission meetings must obtain permission in advance from the Secretary of the Commission. Persons wishing to tape record a Commission meeting should notify the Secretary's office 48 hours in advance of the meeting.

The subject matter of the February 12 closed meeting will be: Formal orders of investigation; Settlement of administrative proceedings of an enforcement nature; Settlement of injunctive action; Institution of injunctive action; Institution of administrative proceedings of an enforcement nature; Consideration of amicus participation.

#### OPEN MEETING - WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 13, 1985 - 2:30 p.m.

The subject matter of the February 13 open meeting will be:

(1) Consideration of whether to approve for publication a notice of a plan filed by the American Stock Exchange, Inc. for the abbreviated reporting of certain minor rule violations, and whether to issue a release adopting an amendment to the Rules of Practice, Section 200.30-3(a) of Title 17, Chapter III. (2) Consideration of two proposed rule changes submitted by the New York Stock Exchange, Inc. (NYSE). The first proposal authorizes the NYSE to establish a market for trading standardized options on individual listed stocks (File No. SR-NYSE-84-3). The second proposal authorizes the NYSE to adopt a revised version of the Allocation Plan (i.e., the lottery system used by the existing options exchanges to allocate underlying equities for options trading), which would accommodate NYSE participation (File No. SR-NYSE-84-10).

(3) Consideration of whether to grant the application of TransCanada Pipelines Limited, a Canadian corporation, for an exemption from the registration provisions of Section 12(g) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, as well as the reporting requirements of Section 15(d) of that Act. (4) Consideration of an application filed by Narragansett Capital Corporation, et al. Narragansett is a publicly-traded venture capital company registered under the Investment Company Act of 1940 as a closed-end, non-diversified, management investment company. The application requests an order granting the exemptive relief needed under the Act to permit the consummation of the transactions proposed in the application, whereby Narragansett would be taken private by its senior management in a leveraged buyout that ultimately would result in a privately held firm not subject to the Act. #### CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

APPOINTMENT OF CONSULTANT FOR FIRST JERSEY SECURITIES, INC.

The New York Regional Office announced that on January 28 Judge Milton Pollack. U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York, chose Benjamin L. Lubin as the Consultant to review the existing sales practices, business operations and supervisory procedures of First Jersey Securities, Inc. to ensure that they comply with the securities laws, Commission regulations and self-regulatory organization guidelines. Judge Pollack ordered the retainment of the Consultant as part of the previously entered Final Judgments of Permanent Injunction by Consent of First Jersey, a registered broker-dealer, and its president and registered principal, Robert E. Brennan.

Lubin is currently a financial consultant to the securities industry, specializing in securities operations for banks, broker-dealers and insurance companies, following an extensive career in the securities business, including membership on several regulatory committees. APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

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The Commission approved proposed rule changes by: The Midwest Securities Trust <u>Company</u> (SR-MSTC-84-9) to amend MSTC Rule 1, Section 3 to extend its right of reversal for credits for interest payments and other distributions for bearer securities from ten business days to 45 calendar days. (Rel. 34-21705); and <u>The Options Clearing Corporation</u> (SR-OCC-84-4) to enable OCC's Board of Directors to invest funds in excess of its working capital in a new, wholly-owned subsidiary organized to engage in the clearance and settlement of commodity options and futures contracts. OCC anticipates that the new subsidiary, The Intermarket Clearing Corporation, will clear cash-settled commodity and futures options contracts. (Rel. 34-21706)
