ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

PROCEEDINGS INSTITUTED AGAINST NORMAN BEHAR

The Commission instituted public administrative proceedings under Section 203 of the Investment Advisers Act of 1940 against Norman Behar, a sole proprietor, who has applied for registration as an investment adviser.

The Order for Proceedings alleges that on March 7, 1983, Behar was convicted in the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York, upon a plea of guilty, to two counts of mail fraud, 18 USC §1341, a felony, and one count of racketeering, 18 USC §1963, a felony, and was sentenced to 45 months in prison and forfeiture of \$125,000.

A hearing will be scheduled to determine: (1) whether the allegations of the Order are true, and to offer Behar the opportunity to establish any defense to such allegations; (2) whether Behar's registration as an investment adviser should be denied; and (3) what, if any, remedial action is necessary in the public interest. CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

ELECTRO-PLASTICS, INC. NAMED IN COMPLAINT

The Commission filed a civil injunctive action on November 25 in the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia against Electro-Plastics, Inc. of Port Newark, New Jersey. The complaint alleges violations of the reporting provisions of the securities laws and seeks a Judgment of Permanent Injunction and Other Equitable Relief.

The Commission alleges that Electro, as part of a continuing course of violative conduct extending over several years, failed to file its Annual Report on Form 10-K for its fiscal year ended May 31, 1985, its Quarterly Report on Form 10-Q for its fiscal quarter ended August 31, 1985, filed late Annual and Quarterly Reports and failed to file Notifications of Late Filing. The Commission requests that the Court order Electro to file its delinquent annual and quarterly reports and enjoin it from further violations of the reporting provisions of the securities laws. (SEC v. Electro Plastics, Inc., USDC DC, Civil Action No. 85-3768). (LR-10942)

CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

CHARLES J. ASCENZI PLEADS GUILTY

The Washington Regional Office announced that on November 4 Charles J. Ascenzi of Silverdale, Pennsylvania pleaded guilty to one count of a two-count indictment which alleged wire fraud and the filing of false documents with a bank having deposits insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation. The indictment alleged that Ascenzi fraudulently obtained \$625,000 from the proceeds of a \$2 million industrial revenue bond issue by the City of West Memphis, Arkansas for the benefit of Maphis Chapman Corporation of Arkansas. It was alleged that Ascenzi represented to the bond trustee that \$625,000 had been expended by Maphis Chapman for manufacturing equipment, and reimbursement from the proceeds of the bond issue was required. In fact, no such equipment had been acquired. Based on Ascenzi's representation, the bond trustee disbursed \$625,000 to him. Ascenzi was enjoined, by consent, in a civil injunctive action brought by the Commission in 1984 relating to the West Memphis bonds. Ascenzi will be sentenced after a sentencing report is prepared. (U.S. v. Charles J. Ascenzi, USDC SDFL, Criminal No. 85-8079-CR-Judge Paine). (LR-10943)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

PRUDENTIAL EMPLOYEES LIMITED PARTNERSHIP-1986

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until December 20 to request a hearing on an application filed by Prudential Employees Limited Partnership-1986 for an order granting certain exemptions from the Investment Company Act in its proposed operation as an employees' securities company. (Rel. IC-14819 - Nov. 26)

FEDERATED GOVERNMENT SECURITIES TRUST

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until December 20 to request a hearing on an application filed by Federated Government Securities Trust requesting an order declaring that it has ceased to be an investment company. (Rel. IC-14820 - Nov. 26)

EDWARD D. JONES & CO.

An order has been issued, effective November 25, exempting Edward D. Jones & Co. (EDJ) and Passport Research, Ltd. from the prohibitions of Section 9(a) of the Investment Company Act. EDJ, a Missouri partnership, is a registered broker-dealer and investment adviser headquartered in Maryland Heights, Missouri. Passport, a Pennsylvania limited partnership, 49 percent owned by EDJ, is a registered investment adviser with headquarters in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania.

The Commission issued a Notice of Filing Application and a Temporary Order of Exemption from the provisions of Section 9(a) on September 26 (Rel. IC-14736). The application was filed in connection with the issuance of an injunction against EDJ in SEC v. Edward D. Jones & Co., (D.D.C. 85-3078). (Rel. IC-14821 - Nov. 27)

COLONIAL PENN SERIES TRUST

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until December 23 to request a hearing on an application filed by Colonial Penn Series Trust, Colonial Penn Investment Advisor Corp. and Rothschild Asset Management Inc. for an order granting an exemption from the provisions of Section 15(a) of the Investment Company Act. The exemption will permit the implementation, without prior shareholder approval, of a new investment advisory agreement and a new sub-advisory agreement. (Rel. IC-14822 - Nov. 27)

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

CNG ENERGY COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until December 23 to request a hearing on a proposal by CNG Energy Company, subsidiary of Consolidated Natural Gas Company, to enter into a marketing contract with the non-associated manufacturer of computer-aided, radio-dispatch systems. (Rel. 35-23924 - Nov. 27)

CONSOLIDATED NATURAL GAS COMPANY

A supplemental order has been issued authorizing Consolidated Natural Gas Company, a registered holding company, to extend until December 31, 1989 the issuance and sale of 102,000 remaining shares of common stock under its dividend reinvestment plan. (Rel. 35-23925 - Nov. 27)

An order has been issued authorizing Consolidated to issue and sell until December 31, 1989 up to 750,000 shares of common stock under its dividend reinvestment plan. (Rel. 35-23926 - Nov. 27)

NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

Proposed rule changes have been filed by: The National Association of Securities Dealers, Inc. (SR-NASD-85-33) that would provide maintenance criteria that a security must satisfy to remain eligible for continued inclusion in the NASD's National List.

(Rel. 34-22664); and The Pacific Clearing Corporation (SR-PCC-85-10) amending its fee schedule to include a "pick-up" charge in connection with its underwriting program. (Rel. 34-22667)

Publication of the proposals are expected to be made in the Federal Register during the weeks of December 2 and November 25, respectively.

APPROVAL OF AMENDMENTS

The Commission approved permanent amendments to the National Association of Securities Dealers, Inc.'s Designation Plan for National Market System (NMS) Securities that provide for revised maintenance criteria that a security must satisfy to remain designated as an NMS Security. (Rel. 34-22665)

APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission approved a proposed rule change filed by the American Stock Exchange, Inc. (SR-Amex-85-18) to permit Amex specialists to use listed options, within specified guidelines, to hedge their underlying specialty stock positions in order to offset market making risks. (Rel. 34-22670)

IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

A proposed rule changes filed by the Pacific Securities Depository Trust Company became effective under Section 19(b)(3)(A) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The proposal (SR-PSDTC-85-11) amends PSDTC's fee schedule to include distribution charges in connection with its underwriting program. (Rel. 34-22668)
