## ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

---

SEC CITES R. W. PETERS, RICKEL & CO., INC., OTHERS

The Commission announced that in public administrative proceedings ordered under Section 15(b) and 19(h) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 (see Rel. 34-20173, September 23, 1983) respondents R.W. Peters, Rickel & Co., Inc., of Union, New Jersey, a municipal securities broker-dealer registered with the Commission, and its two

principals, Robert W. Peters of West Orange, New Jersey and Kenneth D. Rickel of Warren, New Jersey, have submitted an Offer of Settlement which the Commission had decided to accept. Respondents have consented to the issuance of Findings and Order Imposing Remedial Sanctions in this matter without admitting or denying the allegations contained therein.

The Commission's Order found that the firm violated, and Peters and Rickel aided and abetted violations of, Sections 15B(c)(1) and 17(a) of the Exchange Act and Rule 17a-8 (failure to file currency transaction reports) thereunder, and Rules G-8 (customer account information) and G-26 (review of accounts) of the Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board under Section 15B(b)(2) of the Exchange Act.

R.W. Peters, Rickel & Co., Inc. consented to a censure and agreed to comply with certain undertakings designed to prevent the recurrence of similar violations. Robert W. Peters and Kenneth D. Rickel consented to 30 day suspensions from being associated with any broker, dealer, investment company, investment adviser or municipal securities dealer. These suspensions shall remain suspended, if an independent public accountant selected and retained by the firm files a report every six months with the New York Regional Office for a two-year period stating that the firm has complied with the undertakings. Companies and individuals making a tender offer must have on file at the time the tender offer commences a Schedule 14D-1.
