EXCHANGE COMMISSION

ADOPTION OF AN EXEMPTION TO RULE 10a-1

The Commission adopted an exemption from the "tick" provisions of the short sale rule, Rule 10a-1, under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The exemption will facilitate the block positioning activities of broker-dealers who engage in both block positioning and arbitrage. Under the exemption, a broker-dealer selling a security that it acquired while acting in the capacity of a block positioner may, in determining whether it is long or short for purposes of the "tick" provisions of the short sale rule, disregard a proprietary short position in that security if and to the extent that such short position is the subject of one or more offsetting positions created in the course of bona fide arbitrage, risk arbitrage, or bona fide hedge activities.
