ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

GERALD DEAN WEEKS BARRED

The Commission barred Gerald Dean Weeks of Memphis, Tennessee from association with any broker or dealer. The Findings and Order Imposing Remedial Sanctions against Weeks found that he wilfully violated the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws. The Order further found that Weeks had been enjoined from further violations of the registration provisions on January 29, 1980 by the U.S. District Court for the Western District of Tennessee. These sanctions were imposed after Weeks failed to file an answer to the Order for Proceedings dated December 9, 1983, which alleged, in part, that Weeks and others offered and sold unregistered evidences of indebtedness or investment contracts of G. Weeks Securities, Inc. and that the antifraud provisions of the securities laws had been violated. (Rel. 34-20792)

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

TEMPORARY RESTRAINING ORDER AND FREEZE ORDER ISSUED AGAINST STEPHEN G. KARANZALIS, OTHERS

The New York Regional Office announced that on March 22 Judge Charles L. Brieant, U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York, issued a temporary restraining order restraining Stephen G. Karanzalis, Aaron L. Lerman, Alfred T. Salvatore, Jr., and Steven Crow from further violations of the antifraud and tender offer provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The Commission filed its complaint earlier the same day.

The complaint charges Crow and Salvatore, who were respectively, a word processing supervisor and document proofreader at the New York City law firm of Skadden, Arps, Slate, Meagher & Flom (Skadden Arps), with stealing confidential, material non-public information from Skadden Arps' concerning proposed or ongoing tender offers, business combinations and other acquisitions of corporate securities, trading on it, and passing it to others, including Karanzalis and Lerman. The latter also traded and conveyed the information to others.

Karanzalis is a suspended registered representative with Paine, Webber, Jackson & Curtis, Inc. in New York City. Lerman is unemployed, and was formerly a registered representative with Prudential-Bache and Gruntal & Co. in New York City.

The Court also issued a temporary order freezing the defendants' assets and providing for expedited discovery.

The hearing on the Commission's motion for a preliminary injunction was held on April 5. (SEC v. Stephen G. Karanzalis, et al., 84 Civil 2070 [CLB], S.D.N.Y.) (LR-10325)

RICHARD F. CHIPPERFIELD AND MPG, LTD. ORDERED TO SHOW CAUSE

The Boston Regional Office announced that on March 28 the Federal District Court in Rhode Island issued an Order to Show Cause why Richard F. Chipperfield and MPG, Ltd. should not be held in civil contempt of court. The order was signed by U.S. Magistrate Frederick DeCesaris and directs the appearance of Chipperfield and MPG before Senior U.S. District Judge Raymond J. Pettine on April 16 at 9:00 a.m. The order was sought by the Commission in litigation in which Chipperfield and MPG were defendants.

Chipperfield and MPG were permanently enjoined on July 15, 1983 from further violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws. Under the injunction issued by Judge Pettine in 1983, Chipperfield and MPG were ordered to account for all investor funds, identify investors and all bank accounts used by MPG. The Commission alleges, in seeking an order finding Chipperfield and MPG to be in civil contempt, that these earlier orders had not been complied with, despite repeated demands.

In its current motion, the Commission requests the Court to adjudge Chipperfield and MPG in civil contempt, consider appropriate sanctions, fine the defendants \$250 per day until compliance is achieved, and to assess costs and attorneys' fees in favor of the Government. (SEC v. Richard F. Chipperfield, et al., Civil Action No. 81-0572P, D.C. Rhode Island). (LR-10327)

CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

INDICTMENT RETURNED AGAINST ROGER MAGGIO, OTHERS

The New York Regional Office announced that on March 9 a 32-count indictment was returned against Roger Maggio of Rochelle Park, New Jersey, Stuart Harris of Fairlawn, New Jersey, Paul Skulsky of Spring Valley, New York with offices in Englewood Cliffs, New Jersey, and Marc Pozner of Teaneck, New Jersey.

The indictment alleges violations of the conspiracy, false statements, mail fraud, and racketeering sections of Title 18 of the United States Code, and the tax evasion and assistance in preparation of false tax returns sections of Title 26 of the United States Code in a multi-million dollar tax shelter scheme involving the construction and sale of cable television systems.

In December 1980, the Commission instituted a civil injunctive action arising out of the same transactions against Maggio, Harris, Skulsky and others [SEC v. Cable/Tel Corp., et al., 80 Civil 7170 S.D.N.Y.]. In the Commission's action, Maggio, Harris and Skulsky consented, without admitting or denying the allegations, to judgments of permanent injunction enjoining them from future violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws. (U.S. v. Roger Maggio, et al., 84 Crim. 76, D.N.J.). (LR-10326)

DAVID HEUWETTER PLEADS GUILTY

The New York Regional Office and the U.S. Attorney for the Southern District of New York announced that on March 29 David J. Heuwetter of New York City pleaded guilty to an information charging conspiracy, securities fraud and failure to file tax returns. The charges arose from Heuwetter's role in Drysdale Government Securities, which collapsed in May 1982 with almost \$300 million in losses.

Heuwetter, who also faces sentencing for related state charges, may be imprisoned for up to 18 years and fined up to \$105,000 for his tax violations and his part in fraudulently trading billions of dollars in government securities while the firms he represented were insolvent because of massive, hidden short positions. (U.S. v. David J. Heuwetter, 84 Cr. 188, SDNY). (LR-10329)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

FIRST MIDWEST CAPITAL CORPORATION

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until April 27 to request a hearing on an application filed by First Midwest Capital Corporation requesting an order approving follow-on investments in portfolio companies together with other venture capital investors who are affiliated persons of those companies. FEDERATED INCOME & PRIVATE PLACEMENT FUND

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until April 30 to request a hearing on an application by Federated Income & Private Placement Fund, a registered closed-end, non-diversified, management investment company, requesting an order declaring that it has ceased to be an investment company. (Rel. IC-13866 - Apr. 5)

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until April 26 to request a hearing on an application by Equitable Variable Life Insurance Company, its Separate Accounts I and II, and The Equitable Life Assurance Society of the United States for an order exempting them from provisions of Sections 2(a)(32), 2(a)(35), 18(i), 22(c), 22(d), 27(a)(1), 27(a)(2), 27(a)(3), 27(c)(1), 27(d), and 27(f) of the Investment Company Act and Rules 6e-2(b)(1), 6e-2(b)(10), 6e-2(b)(12), 6e-2(b)(13), 6e-2(c), 22c-1, and 27f-1 to permit the transactions described in the application. (Rel. IC-13868 - Apr. 5)

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

CENTRAL AND SOUTH WEST FUELS, INC.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until April 27 to request a hearing on a proposal by Central Power and Light Company (CPL), Public Service Company of Oklahoma (PSO), Southwestern Electric Power Company (SWEPCO), and West Texas Utilities (WTU), subsidiaries of Central and South West Corporation (CSW), together with Central and South West Services, Inc. (CSWS) and Central and South West Fuels (CSWF), whereby CSWF will be dissolved and its functions be assumed by a fuels department of CSWS. Long term budgets for various fuel projects have also been proposed. (Rel. 35-23275 - Apr. 5)

CONSOLIDATED NATURAL GAS COMPANY

A supplemental order has been issued authorizing Consolidated Natural Gas Company, a registered holding company, to amend its charter and solicit proxies in connection therewith concerning certain business combinations. A written opinion will be issued at a later date. (Rel. 35-23276 - Apr. 5)

APPALACHIAN POWER COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing Appalachian Power Company, subsidiary of American Electric Power Company, Inc., to incur obligations under a pollution control facilities sales agreement with Mason County, West Virginia (County). Appalachian would incur obligations which run parallel to the County's obligations under a series of refunding bonds in the aggregate amount of \$30 million to be issued and sold by the County. The proceeds of these bonds will be used to refund maturing bonds. (Rel. 35-23277 - Apr. 6)

The proposal (SR-NSCC-84-2), which related to NSCC's Envelope Settlement System (ESS), incorporates into NSCC's rules an existing procedure, with one modification, pertaining to remedies available to NSCC members who receive incomplete ESS deliveries. ACCELERATED APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission approved, on an accelerated basis, a proposed rule change filed by the American Stock Exchange, Inc. The rule change (SR-Amex-84-6) would permit open trading to continue until 4:00 p.m. on the Friday prior to expiration in expiring series of stock options. (Rel. 34-20832)

TRUST INDENTURE ACT RELEASES

STANDARD OIL COMPANY OF INDIANA

An order has been issued on the application by Standard Oil Company of Indiana under Section 310(b)(ii) of the Trust Indenture Act of 1939. The application declares that the trusteeship of The Northern Trust Company of three indentures of or related to Standard, two of which are qualified under the Act, is not so likely to involve a material conflict of interest as to make it necessary to disqualify Northern Trust from acting as trustee under more than one of such indentures.
