EXTENSION OF COMMENT PERIOD ON PROPOSED NEW REGISTRATION FORMS FOR INSURANCE COMPANY SEPARATE ACCOUNTS

The Commission is extending until June 15 the date by which comments must be submitted on proposed new registration Forms N-3 and N-4 for insurance company separate accounts offering variable annuity contracts. The Commission published and requested written comments on the proposal in Release IC-13689 (December 22, 1983).

Comments should be submitted in triplicate to George A. Fitzsimmons, Secretary, Securities and Exchange Commission, 450 Fifth Street, NW, Washington, DC 20549. Comments must be received by June 15 and should refer to File No. S7-1007. All submissions will be available for public inspection in the Public Reference Room. (Rel. IC-13800)

ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

TEMPORARY SUSPENSION OF REGULATION A EXEMPTION FOR WESTAR FINANCIAL, INC.

The Commission ordered that the conditional exemption from registration provided by Regulation A claimed by Westar Financial, Inc. be temporarily suspended under Rule 261(a) of Regulation A. Westar had claimed the Regulation A exemption in a filing for the sale of its common stock beginning August 18, 1982 under Section 3(b) of the Securities Act of 1933.

The Order temporarily suspending the conditional exemption provides that the suspension is based upon alleged: false, misleading or inaccurate statements in a Form 2-A (Report Pursuant to Rule 260 of Regulation A) filed with the Commission on June 7, 1983 as the final report regarding sales under the Regulation A offering; inaccuracies in the "Plan of Distribution" set forth in the Regulation A offering circular; and, failure by the president of Westar to cooperate with the Commission's inquiry regarding this matter.

The Order temporarily suspending the Regulation A offering further provides that appropriate persons having an interest in the matter may file with the Secretary of the Commission a written request for a hearing within 30 days after the date of the Order was entered. If such request is received, the Commission will set a hearing to determine whether the suspension should be made permanent. If no such hearing is requested, the Order will become permanent on the 30th day after its entry. (Rel. 33-6532)

BROKER-DEALER REGISTRATION REVOKED AND PRINCIPALS BARRED

The Commission accepted an Offer of Settlement in the public administrative proceedings against Link-Up+1 Securities, Inc., Jerome A. Bernstein and Lawrence Bernstein of Denver, Colorado. The settlement includes findings that: (1) the respondents wilfully violated the registration and antifraud provisions of the Securities Act of 1933, and wilfully violated the net capital, books and records, early warning, and antifraud provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934; (2) in August 1979, a trustee was appointed for Link-Up+1 under the Securities Investor Protection Act; (3) in January 1980, the respondents were permanently enjoined from future violations of the securities laws; and (4) in February 1981, the Bernsteins pleaded guilty to wire fraud in the offer and sale of securities.

The sanctions imposed are a permanent revocation of Link-Up+1's registration and a 10-year bar of the Bernsteins from association in the securities industry. After 18 months, however, Lawrence Bernstein may apply to become associated in a supervised, non-supervisory, non-licensed, non-sales capacity. (Rel. 34-20940)

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

COMPLAINT NAMES SOUTHERN RESERVE, INC.

The Commission filed a civil injunctive action on May 16 in the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia against Southern Reserve, Inc. of Springfield, New Jersey. The complaint alleges violations of the reporting provisions of the securities laws and seeks a Judgment of Permanent Injunction and Other Equitable Relief.

The Commission alleges that Southern, as part of a continuing course of violative conduct extending over several years, failed to file: its Annual Reports on Form 10-K for its fiscal years ended December 31, 1982 and 1983, required to have been filed by March 31, 1983 and March 30, 1984, respectively; various periodic reports on time; and required Notifications of Late Filing on Form 12b-25. The Commission requests that the Court order Southern to file its delinquent Annual and Quarterly reports and enjoin it from further violations of the reporting provisions of the securities laws. (SEC v. Southern Reserve, Inc., USDC DC, Civil Action No. 84-1535). (LR-10387)

DAVID A. HUNT AND RONALD G. VOGELTANZ ENJOINED

The Seattle Regional Office and Charles Turner, U.S. Attorney for Oregon, announced that on April 18, as the result of an agreed settlement, Judge James A. Redden signed an order enjoining: David A. Hunt of Vancouver, Washington, Ronald G. Vogeltanz of Oregon, and Orchards Accounting and Tax Service (Orchards), Hunt's sole proprietorship, from further violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws; Hunt and Orchards from acting as unregistered broker-dealers and investments advisers and from violating the antifraud provisions of the Advisers Act; and Hunt, Vogeltanz and Orchards Accounting and Tax Service, Inc., a Washington corporation, from making any untrue statements of material fact or omitting to state a required material fact in an application to the Commission to become registered as an investment adviser.

The law suit stemmed from an investigation of the sale of notes of Hunt and Orchards to public investors in Oregon and Washington. (SEC v. Orchards Accounting & Tax Service, et al., District of Oregon). (LR-10383)

PETER N. BRANT, OTHERS ENJOINED

The Commission filed a complaint on May 17 in the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York against Peter N. Brant, Kenneth P. Felis, R. Foster Winans, Jr., David W.C. Clark and David J. Carpenter. The complaint seeks a temporary restraining order and preliminary and permanent injunctions restraining and enjoining Brant, Felis, Winans and Clark from violations of the antifraud provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and the Securities Act of 1933, and restraining and enjoining Carpenter from further violations of the antifraud provisions of the Exchange Act. The complaint also requests an accounting for, and disgorgement of, all monies obtained as a result of the alleged violative conduct, a temporary order freezing the assets of the defendants, and a temporary restraining order and preliminary injunction prohibiting Brant and Felis from tampering with evidence.

The complaint alleges that: beginning about October 1983 the defendants, directly and indirectly, effected transactions in the securities of certain issuers while in possession of material, nonpublic information improperly disclosed by Winans, a reporter for the Wall Street Journal, to Brant, a broker for Kidder, Peabody & Co., concerning the imminent publication of articles in the Journal's "Heard on the Street" column; and Winans disclosed this information and misappropriated it for his own benefit or indirect personal benefit in breach of a duty to the Journal, and its parent company, Dow Jones & Co. (SEC v. Peter N. Brant, et al., USDC SDNY, 84 Civ. 3470). (LR-10386)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

VALIC TIMED OPPORTUNITY FUND, INC.

An order has been issued exempting VALIC Timed Opportunity Fund, Inc. from the provisions of Sections 17(f) and 18(f)(1) of the Investment Company Act to permit it to invest in stock index futures contracts and interest rate futures contracts for hedging purposes. (Rel. IC-13943 - May 16)

PUTNAM MANAGEMENT COMPANY, INC.

An order has been issued exempting certain directors or trustees of the Putnam Funds, their adviser and distributor, and the Eberstadt Funds and their adviser and distributor, from the definition of "interested person" within the meaning of Section 2(a) (19) of the Investment Company Act solely by reason of their holding limited indirect interests in securities of Marsh & McLennan Companies, Inc. (Rel. IC-13944 - May 16)

HUTTON INVESTMENT SERIES INC.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until June 11 to request a hearing on an application filed by Hutton Investment Series Inc., a series open-end, diversified, management investment company, for an order amending a previous order which exempted Hutton from the provisions of Sections 2(a)(32), 2(a)(35), 2(a)(41), 22(c) and 22(d) of the Investment Company Act and Rules 2a-4 and 22c-1 to permit it to waive contingent deferred sales charges respecting periodic redemptions of shares, under a systematic withdrawal plan it proposes to offer shareholders having accounts of \$10,000 or more. SEARS FIXED INCOME INVESTMENT TRUST

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until June 11 to request a hearing on an application filed by Sears Fixed Income Investment Trust, and subsequent trusts and similar series of trusts (the Trusts), and their sponsor, Dean Witter Reynolds, Inc., for an order granting confidential treatment of certain information filed with the Trusts' registration statements. HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

ALLEGHENY POWER SYSTEM, INC.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until June 13 to request a hearing on a proposal of Allegheny Power System, Inc., a registered holding company, to issue and sell from time to time not more than 3,000,000 shares of common stock under its Dividend Reinvestment and Stock Purchasen Plan and its Employee Stock Ownership and Savings Plan. SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

PARTIAL APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission extended until June 14 its summary and temporary approval of portions of a rule change proposed by the Chicago Board Options Exchange, Incorporated (SR-CBOE-80-16). The provisions of the rule being approved relate to appointment and oversight of market makers while the remainder requires that a minimum portion of a market maker's options transactions be executed in person. ACCELERATED APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission approved, on an accelerated basis, a proposed rule change filed by the Chicago Board Options Exchange, Incorporated (SR-CBOE-84-18) to extend until May 22 CBOE's pilot program. CBOE member firms may use CBOE's Order Support System to route electronically to CBOE's limit order book any public customer limit orders for Standard and Poor's Telecommunications Index Options. TRUST INDENTURE ACT RELEASES

TRANS WORLD AIRLINES, INC.

An order has been issued under the Trust Indenture Act of 1939 on an amended application of Trans World Airlines, Inc. that the trusteeships of The Bank of New York, under four indentures of Trans World, are not so likely to involve a material conflict of interest to disqualify The Bank from acting as trustee.
