WITHDRAWAL OF PROPOSED RULE 24a-1

The Commission withdrew proposed Rule 24a-1, pending since February 27, 1981, that would have provided a definition of documents "otherwise obtained" by the Commission within the meaning of Section 24(a) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, which defines agency records for purposes of the Freedom of Information Act. The Commission withdrew the proposal since it has chosen instead to seek legislation amending Section 24(a). (Rel. 34-21088)

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

CIVIL ACTION FILED AGAINST THE BARDEN CORPORATION AND ROBERT P. MORE

The Commission today filed a civil action against The Barden Corporation of Danbury, Connecticut, and Robert P. More alleging that they aided and abetted violations of the antifraud, reporting, and accounting provisions of the securities laws. The defendants consented to Final Judgments of Permanent Injunction without admitting or denying the complaint's allegations.

The complaint alleges that: during 1981 and 1982, Barden and More provided substantial cooperation and assistance in furthering and concealing practices engaged in by United States Surgical Corporation under which Surgical's earnings and financial condition were materially overstated in financial statements contained in annual and quarterly reports filed with the Commission; Barden and More participated in the falsification of records; between April 1981 and January 1982, on instructions from Surgical, More caused Barden to submit invoices to Surgical on behalf of Lacey, a division of Barden, that falsely stated that over \$1 million of stapling instruments was cost of dies; and during the audit for Surgical's 1981 fiscal year, Barden, through More, provided false information to Surgical's auditors. RICHARD H. REED AND MARVIN LOSIE CONSENT TO PERMANENT INJUNCTIONS; INJUNCTION BY DEFAULT ENTERED AGAINST PURCHASING CONSULTANTS, INC.

The Chicago Regional Office announced that on June 20 Judge Nicholas J. Walinski, U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Ohio, Western Division, entered Final Judgments and Orders of Permanent Injunction against Purchasing Consultants, Inc. (PCI), Richard H. Reed and Marvin Losie. Reed, who was the President and a Director of PCI, and Losie, who acted as a salesman for the sale of PCI securities, consented to the injunctions without admitting or denying the complaint's allegations. The injunction was entered by default against PCI. The injunctions arose from a scheme to defraud investors in the offer and sale of PCI securities. The complaint alleged that: PCI and Reed misrepresented the profitability of the issuer and the use made of the proceeds from the sale of PCI securities; and Losie misrepresented the return investors could expect on their investment and the use made of proceeds from the sale of PCI securities.

The complaint in the PCI case is still pending against Joseph L. Souliere, who is also alleged to have been a salesman for the sale of PCI securities. (SEC v. Purchasing Consultants, Inc., et al., No. C-84-7293, ND OH, filed March 29, 1984). (LR-10427)

The Fort Worth Regional Office announced that on June 14 Judge James O. Ellison, U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Oklahoma, issued an order permanently enjoining Donald E. Smolen of Tulsa, Oklahoma, from further violations of the antifraud provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. Smolen consented to the order without admitting or denying the complaint's allegations.

The February 7 complaint alleges that: Smolen purchased options contracts through various broker-dealers and issued checks to pay for the securities; Smolen then stopped payment on certain of these checks and knew that certain others would not be honored when presented for payment; and, as a result of the foregoing, Smolen's options positions were liquidated and the broker-dealers lost a combined total of approximately \$750,000. (SEC v. Donald E. Smolen, CA 84-C-78-E, ND OK, February 7, 1984). (LR-10428)

FINAL ORDER PROHIBITING ANTIFRAUD VIOLATIONS ENTERED AGAINST JAMES D. LEWIS

The Atlanta Regional Office announced that on June 15 U.S. District Judge Thomas G. Hull, for the Eastern District of Tennessee, entered a Final Order against James D. Lewis of Gate City, Virginia. The Final Order prohibits Lewis from violating the antifraud provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 in the purchase and sale of Johnson County Bank (JCB) common stock or any other security. Specifically, the Order prohibits Lewis from misrepresenting or omitting to state material facts concerning the issuer's financial condition, the book value of its stock, and the prices paid to purchase stock. Lewis, the former president and a director of JCB, a statechartered federally insured bank located in Mountain City, Tennessee, consented to the Final Order without admitting or denying the complaint's allegations.

In its August 11, 1983 complaint, the Commission alleged that Lewis, from December 1982 to February 14, 1983, engaged in a scheme to defraud shareholders and others in the purchase of approximately 25,000 shares of JCB common stock on behalf of two undisclosed principals. (SEC v. James D. Lewis, Civil Action No. CIV-2-83-228, USDC ED TN). (LR-10429)

Orders have been issued declaring that the following companies have ceased to be investment companies: Federated Equity Trust, Federated Money Market Trust, and Federated Bond Trust; IDS Fixed Income Portfolio, Inc.; IDS Capital Appreciation Portfolio, Inc.; and IDS Managed Equity Portfolio, Inc. (Rel. IC-14000; IC-14001; IC-14002; IC-14003 - June 22)

BASIC EARTH SCIENCE SYSTEMS, INC.

An order has been issued declaring that Basic Earth Sciences Systems, Inc. is not an investment company within the meaning of the Investment Company Act. (Rel. IC-14004 - June 22)

MORTGAGE BANKERS FINANCIAL CORPORATION I

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until July 17 to request a hearing on an application filed by Mortgage Bankers Financial Corporation I, a limited purpose finance corporation, for an order exempting it from all provisions of the Investment Company Act. (Rel. IC-14005 - June 25)

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

NEW ENGLAND ELECTRIC SYSTEM

A supplemental order has been issued authorizing New England Electric System, a registered holding company, and one of its subsidiaries, New England Power Company (NEP), to sell four remaining surplus diesel generator units and associated equipment owned by NEP. (Rel. 35-23338 - June 22)

AMERICAN ELECTRIC POWER COMPANY, INC.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until July 16 to request a hearing on a proposal by American Electric Power Company, Inc., a registered holding company, to act as indemnitor, guarantor and/or surety for the benefit of its subsidiaries in certain situations. (Rel. 35-23339 - June 22)

LISTING, DELISTING AND UNLISTED TRADING ACTIONS

UNLISTED TRADING GRANTED

An order has been issued granting the applications of the <u>Cincinnati Stock Exchange</u> for unlisted trading privileges in 12 issues which are listed and registered on one or more other national securities exchange and are reported in the consolidated transaction reporting system. SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The following filed proposed rule changes under Rule 19b-4: The New York Stock Exchange, Inc. (SR-NYSE-84-21) to implement certain enhancements to the NYSE's Designated Order Turnaround and Limit Systems as well as an Immediate Reporting Service for specified securities. (Rel. 34-21084); and The Pacific Securities Depository Trust Company (SR-PSDTC-84-6) to establish a Units Program through which PSDTC would provide its participants depository services for eligible unit issues, combinations of two to four component securities issued and traded as a single security. The proposed rule change would specify general procedures governing the deposit, withdrawal and transfer of unit issues and/or their component parts to or from participants' classified, unclassified or loan free positions. APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission approved a proposed rule change filed under Rule 19b-4 by the New York Stock Exchange, Inc. (SR-NYSE-84-13) to provide for a minimum fractional change in premium bids or offers for index options of 1/16 of \$100 (\$6.25) regardless of the size of the premium. (Rel. 34-21085)
