ADOPTION OF RULE EXEMPTION FOR CUSTODY OF INVESTMENT COMPANY ASSETS OUTSIDE THE UNITED STATES

The Commission has adopted Rule 17f-5 under the Investment Company Act of 1940 to permit registered U.S. and Canadian investment companies to keep their foreign securities, cash and cash equivalents with foreign custodians under certain conditions. The Commission is also issuing notices advising The Chase Manhattan Bank, N.A. and the Bank of New York of its intent to modify certain conditions of their existing exemptive orders to conform to Rule 17f-5. ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

PROCEEDINGS INSTITUTED AGAINST FINANCIAL NEWS ASSOCIATES

The Commission instituted public administrative proceedings under the Investment Advisers Act of 1940 against Financial News Associates (FNA), doing business as Center for Strategic Investing (Center), in Woodbridge, Virginia.

The Order for Proceedings alleges that FNA wilfully violated the registration provisions of the Advisers Act by advertising for and publishing "Investment Intelligence," an investment advisory newsletter, while not being registered with the Commission. The Order also alleges that FNA wilfully violated the antifraud provisions of the Advisers Act (Sections 206(1), 206(2) and 206(4)) and the advertising rule by mailing to prospective subscribers 1,670,000 advertising letters for "Investment Intelligence" which contained false and misleading statements of material facts concerning, among other things: the Center's past investment performance; its length of time in business; its connection with intelligence professionals and its reliance for its newsletter upon information derived from them; the existence of an "Intelligence Board of Advisers" composed of intelligence professionals formerly affiliated with intelligence agencies; newspaper articles allegedly written about the Center; and the scope of the Center's activities other than the publication of the newsletter.

A hearing will be scheduled to determine whether the allegations against respondents are true. (Rel. IA-927)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

PACIFIC FUNDING CORPORATION

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until October 1 to request a hearing on an application of Pacific Funding Corporation (Applicant) amending and restating its previous application and requesting a new order of the Commission. The new order would exempt Applicant from all provisions of the Act in order to allow it to engage in certain transactions that were not contemplated in the original application, and thus were not covered by the original order.
