## RULES AND RELATED MATTERS

COMMENTS REQUESTED CONCERNING INCREASED UNIFORMITY BETWEEN FEDERAL AND STATE SECURITIES SYSTEMS

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The Commission and the North American Securities Administrators Association (NASAA) is requesting comments on effectuating increased uniformity in the state and Federal regulation of securities matters. The release contains a tentative agenda of topics to be discussed by representatives of the Commission and NASAA at a conference that is intended to carry out the policies and purposes of Section 19(c) of the Securities Act of 1933, maximize the effectiveness of securities regulation, and reduce burdens on capital formation through increased cooperation between the Commission and state securities regulatory authorities.

### **CIVIL PROCEEDINGS**

OFFICERS AND DIRECTORS OF GULF RESOURCES INDICTED

The Commission announced that on December 10 James A. Rolfe, U.S. Attorney for the Northern District of Texas, disclosed that a federal jury returned an idictment against Dean B. Wolzen, Jerry D. Eutsler, Floyd D. Wallace, Richard Allen Ellis and others. The indictment charges each defendant with 12 felony counts, including one count each of securities fraud and conspiracy to commit securities fraud. The indictment relates to the activities of the defendants in the offer and sale of the securities of Gulf Resources Inc. and its predecessor companies.

In connection with these activities, Wolzen, Eutsler, Wallace and Ellis had previously consented to permanent injunctions enjoining them from future violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws. VAN KAMPEN MERRITT, INC.

An order has been issued exempting Van Kampen Merritt, Inc., Insured Municipals Income Trusts and American Portfolio Advisory Service, Inc. from the provisions of Sections 26(a)(2)(C) and 17(a) of the Investment Company Act, and permitting them to engage in certain joint transactions. ### **SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS**

#### NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

Proposed rule changes have been filed by: <u>The American Stock Exchange, Inc.</u> (SR-Amex-84-37) which would authorize Amex to expand its Amex Options Switch System (AMOS) by increasing the limit on AMOS options market and marketable limit orders from five to ten contracts, and permitting away-from-the-market options limit orders for up to 100 contracts. (Rel. 34-21548); <u>The Chicago Board Options Exchange, Inc</u>. (SR-CBOE-84-30) which would authorize CBOE to implement a retail automatic execution system for certain S&P 100 Stock Index Options orders on a pilot basis. (Rel. 34-21549); and <u>The Midwest Clearing Corporation</u> (SR-MCC-84-8) which conforms MCC's municipal securities processing procedures to National Securities Clearing Corporation's procedures. The proposal provides that MCC will exit positions from its continuous net settlement system if a: (1) participant seeks to buy-in municipal securities to satisfy a long position; or (2) municipal security issue is declared ineligible for CNS. The proposal also makes bearer securities eligible for clearance and deposit at MCC. (Rel. 34-21550).

Publication of the proposals are expected to be made in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of December 10.

#### IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

A rule change filed by the National Securities Clearing Corporation has become effective under Section 19(b)(3)(A) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The proposed rule change (SR-NSCC-84-13) enables NSCC to provide its members with Trade Date Contract lists for trade data reported to NSCC by self-regulatory organizations or service bureaus.
