OPEN MEETING - THURSDAY, MARCH 2, 1989 - 10:00 a.m.

The subject matter of the March 2 open meeting will be:

- (1) Consideration of whether to publish for comment amendments to Schedules 13D, 14D-1, 14B, and 13E-3 under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 which, among other things, would require the disclosure of information concerning the identity and background of limited partners and other participants holding significant investments in the limited partnership or other entity engaging in a particular transaction. - (2) Consideration of whether to publish for comment amendments to Rules 13d-1, 13d-2, and 13d-7 and Schedules 13D and 13G under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 which, among other things, would provide that any person, other than an institutional investor currently entitled to file on Schedule 13G in certain circumstances, who acquires or holds more than five percent but not 20 percent or more, of a class of equity securities with a passive investment purpose, would be permitted to report that acquisition on short-form Schedule 13G within 10 days after the acquisition. ### **COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS**

ORDER DENYING REQUEST

The General Counsel sent a letter to Thomas W. Jeffrey, Esq., determining that disclosure of certain materials responsive to Jeffrey's Freedom of Information Act request can no longer reasonably be expected to interfere with a Commission enforcement proceeding. The General Counsel therefore reversed the FOIA Officer's decision to withhold that material under Exemption 7(A), and remanded that portion of Jeffrey's request to the FOIA Officer for consideration of whether other exemptions might apply. As to the remainder of Jeffrey's request, which had not yet been processed by the FOIA Officer, the General Counsel denied Jeffrey's request to expedite that processing. The General Counsel determined that the responsive documents were voluminous, that similarly voluminous production would also be required in response to 33 requests received prior to Jeffrey's, and that the Commission was exercising due diligence by processing Jeffrey's request, through its first-in, first-out system, only after the earlier requests had been processed. Moreover, the General Counsel concluded that Jeffrey had not presented an exceptional need for his request to be given priority over other requests for voluminous production which the Commission received before his. ## **ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS**

RULE 2(e) PROCEEDING INSTITUTED AND SETTLED AGAINST EDMOND A. MORRISON, III

The Commission issued an Order Instituting Proceedings under Rule 2(e) of its Rules of Practice against Edmond A. Morrison, III, CPA. Simultaneously, Morrison submitted an Offer of Settlement which the Commission accepted.

In his Offer Morrison, without admitting or denying the Order's allegations, consented to the Order which made findings that Morrison engaged in improper professional conduct in that he failed to conduct his audits of Levin International Corporation's fiscal 1983 through 1985 financial statements in accordance with Generally Accepted Auditing Standards (GAAS), and caused his firm to issue Accountant's Reports which incorrectly state that such financial statements were prepared in conformity with generally accepted accounting standards and that the audits were conduct in accordance with GAAS.

The Commission ordered that Morrison be denied the privilege of appearing or practicing before it as an independent public accountant; provided that after four years from the date of the Order, Morrison may apply to the Commission to resume appearing and practicing upon a showing that he has met certain eductional and professional association requirements. ## **CIVIL PROCEEDINGS**

INJUNCTIVE ACTION INSTITUTED AND SETTLED AGAINST LEVIN INTERNTIONAL CORPORATION, OTHERS

The Commission filed on February 23 a Complaint for Injunctive and Other Equitable Relief in the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia against Levin International Corporation, Howard S. Levin, and Sydell R. Kraft.

Without admitting or denying the allegations in the Complaint, defendants consented to the Final Judgments of Permanent Injunction enjoining them from further violations of the antifraud provisions of the securities laws. Furthermore, Levin International was enjoined from further violations of, and Levin and Kraft were enjoined from aiding and abetting violations of, the issuer reporting and books and records provisions of the securities laws. In addition, defendants were ordered to cause Levin International to file with the Commission its delinquent fiscal year 1987 annual report and to restate its fiscal year 1985 financial statements.

The Complaint alleges that Levin International's public filings frfom 1983 through 1986 contained financial statements which improperly reported as assets \$5.8 million in restructured notes receivables and accrued interest thereon, improperly reported as income annual accrued interest of over \$600,000, and improperly excluded from expenses and liabilities an annual rental obligation of \$1.3 million. ### **INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES**

#### THE PRUDENTIAL INSURANCE COMPANY OF AMERICA

An order has been issued exempting The Prudential Insurance Company of America, The Prudential Individual Variable Contract Account, and Pruco Securities Corporation from the provisions of Sections 2(a)(32), 22(c), 26(a)(2)(c), 27(c)(1), 27(c)(2), and 27(d) of the Investment Company Act and Rule 22c-1 to permit the issuance of variable annuity contracts providing for a recapturable bonus equal to 1% of certain purchase payments and to permit the deduction of a mortality and expense risk charge from the assets of the Account. #### WNC HOUSING TAX CREDIT FUND, L.P.

#### ALABAMA POWER COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing Alabama Power Company, subsidiary of The Southern Company, to sell an 8.16% undivided ownership interest in Units No. 1 and 2 of its James H. Miller, Jr. Steam Electric Generating Plan and related facilities to Alabama Electric Cooperative, a generating and transmitting cooperative, pursuant to a Purchase and Ownership Agreement. #### SYSTEM ENERGY RESOURCES, INC.

A supplemental order has been issued correcting a prior order dated February 21, 1989 [Rel. 35-24825] which authorized System Energy Resources, Inc., subsidiary of Middle South Utilities, Inc., to acquire its nuclear fuel by lease in the approximate amount of up to \$185 million. The correction restates the alternate interest rate availale to the lessor under a related credit agreement for revolving credit loans as .775 of 1% in excess of the London Interbank Offered Rate.
