ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

STOP ORDER PROCEEDINGS INSTITUTED AGAINST COMPOSITE DESIGN, INC.

> The Commission instituted public administrative proceedings under Section 8(d) of the Securities Act of 1933 against Composite Design, Inc., formerly known as SRS Technical, Inc. A hearing has been scheduled to determine whether the allegations in the Division of Enforcement's Statement of Matters are true and whether a Stop Order suspending the effectiveness of the company's registration statement should be issued.

> The Statement of Matters alleges that Composite Design failed to cooperate, or obstructed or refused to permit the Division of Enforcement's examination under Section 8(e) of the Securities Act. It further alleges that Composite Design's registration statement, as amended, included untrue statements of material facts concerning, among other things, their officers and directors; their principal shareholders; the beneficial ownership of their securities; the control of the issuer; the plan of distribution; and their intent regarding an acquisition. CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

INJUNCTION AND DISGORGEMENT ORDERED AGAINST DENNIS L. ASTORRI, OTHERS

> The Philadelphia Regional Office announced that on February 10 Final Judgments of Permanent Injunction by Default, together with Orders of Disgorgement, were entered against Dennis L. Astorri, 1st Securities of America, Inc., and Diane M. Kronyak. The Judgments enjoin defendants from violating or aiding and abetting violations of the antifraud and broker-dealer net capital provisions of the Securities Act of 1934. The Order also requires defendants to disgorge \$311,511 for distribution to investors.

The September 20, 1988 Complaint alleged that Astorri, president and sole shareholder of 1st Securities, a registered broker-dealer, together with Kronyak, an employee of 1st Securities, conducted a fraudulent scheme to offer and sale securities in the form of interests in an investment pool, investment bonds and notes. The Complaint also alleged that defendants fraudulently obtained \$311,511 from at least eight investors. It further alleged that Astorri aided and abetted 1st Securities' violations of the net capital provisions. Defendants never answered the Complaint. (SEC v. Dennis L. Astorri, et al., D. Del., Civil Action No. 88-523). (LR-12009)

INJUNCTIVE ACTION FILED AGAINST JACK N. POLEVOI AND JERRY N. POLEVOI

The Los Angeles Regional Office filed a civil injunctive action on February 21 in the U.S. District Court for the Central District of California against Jack N. Polevoi and Jerry N. Polevoi, alleging violations of the antifraud provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The Complaint alleges that defendants, both of whom were officers of ZZZZ Best Co., Inc., traded in the securities of ZZZZ Best while in possession of adverse material non-public information concerning, among other things, the resignation of Barry Minkow, the company's founder, chairman of the board, president and chief executive officer. The Complaint seeks injunctive relief, disgorgement of approximately \$225,000 from the trades and payment of penalties under the Insider Trading Sanctions Act of 1984. (SEC v. Jack N. Polevoi and Jerry N. Polevoi, CDCA, Civil Action No. 89-1001 Par(Kx)). (LR-12011)

CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

WILLIAM RAY WHITE SENTENCED

The Atlanta Regional and Miami Branch Offices announced that on February 7 U.S. District Judge Thomas Hull, Eastern District of Tennessee, sentenced William Ray White of Morristown, Tennessee, formerly of Fort Lauderdale, Florida, to ten years imprisonment followed by five years probation, in connection with White's plea of guilty to five counts of a 14-count indictment charging him with wire, securities, and mail fraud.

White was formerly employed as a registered representative and principal in charge of a securities broker-dealer registered with the Commission. The indictment charged that between March 1984 and September 1987, White obtained over \$900,000 from an investor by, among other misrepresentations, falsely stating that the investor's funds would be used to purchase, on margin, U.S. Treasury Bills and Zero Coupon U.S. Treasury Notes. It further charged that White misappropriated the investor's funds. Based on facts similar to those alleged in the indictment, a final judgment of permanent injunction was entered against White on July 20, 1988, permanently enjoining him from further violations of the antifraud provisions of the securities laws. (U.S. v. William Ray White, Case No. 87-6971-CIV-ZLOCH, SDFL). (LR-12012)

Companies and individuals must report to the Commission within ten days on Schedule 13D if after the acquisition of equity securities of a public company their beneficial interest therein exceeds five percent. Persons eligible to use the short form (Schedule 13G) may in lieu of filing a Schedule 13D file a Schedule 13G within 45 days after the end of the calendar year in which the person became subject to Section 13(d)(1). Companies and individuals making a tender offer must have on file at the time the tender offer commences a Schedule 14D-1.
