## **COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS**

JAMES L. SANDERS NAMED REGIONAL ADMINISTRATOR OF LOS ANGELES REGIONAL OFFICE

David S. Ruder, Chairman of the Commission, today announced the appointment of James L. Sanders as Regional Administrator of the Commission's Los Angeles Regional Office. In announcing the selection, Chairman Ruder said, "Throughout his career, James Sanders has demonstrated excellent judgment, strong litigation skills, and effective leadership. I am confident that he will do an outstanding job for the Commission."

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Mr. Sanders is an Assistant U.S. Attorney with the Major Fraud Unit of the Los Angeles U.S. Attorney's Office. Previously, he was an Assistant U.S. Attorney in Chicago, where he was a member of the Special Prosecutions Division. He began his legal career in 1974 with the Commission in its Chicago Regional Office following graduation from the University of Tulsa Law School. While with the Commission, he became a Branch Chief in the enforcement section and was responsible for a number of major securities cases. As an Assistant U.S. Attorney, he has handled cases involving insider trading, stock market manipulation, RICO, bribery of public officials, income tax evasion, and mail fraud. (Press Release 89-31)

### **ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS**

NASD ACTION AGAINST LSCO SECURITIES, INC.

The Commission affirmed sanctions imposed by the NASD on LSCO Securities, Inc., a Wichita, Kansas brokerage firm, Bob F. Larmer, its president, Arthur Sykes, Jr., a director and registered principal, Russell I. Teel, vice president, and Pearl I. Hummel, cashier. The NASD censured Respondents, fined LSCO and Larmer \$7,500, jointly and severally, imposed a separate \$1,000 joint and several fine on LSCO, Larmer, and Teel, and suspended Larmer from association with any NASD member for ten business days.

The Commission found, as had the NASD, that, in 1985, LSCO, Larmer, and Sykes were responsible for charging customers unfair markups in sales of Merge Tech, Inc. stock; that LSCO, Larmer, and Teel were responsible for sales literature sent to customers by the firm's registered representatives that violated NASD standards, and for failing to observe NASD supervisory requirements with respect to such literature; and that LSCO, Larmer, and Hummel failed to comply with net capital, customer protection, and recordkeeping requirements.

In affirming the sanctions assessed by the NASD, the Commission stated that respondents' violations "involved rules that provide important safeguards for the protection of public investors." It also noted that the firm and Larmer had previously been disciplined twice by the NASD. (Rel. 34-26779)

PROCEEDINGS INSTITUTED AGAINST GLENN GOLENBERG AND LAWRENCE ADLER

On May 8, Judge Bell from the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Ohio entered Judgment in <u>SEC v. Glenn Golenberg, et al.</u>, filed on May 1 [see LR-12074]. Subsequently, on May 8, the Commission instituted separate administrative proceedings against Golenberg and Lawrence Adler under Section 15(b)(6) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. Simultaneously, Golenberg and Adler offered Offers of Settlement for the purpose of disposing of the issues raised by these proceedings.

In accepting their Offers of Settlement, the Commission found that Golenberg and Adler had been permanently enjoined by the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Ohio from future violations of the antifraud provisions of the Exchange Act. Based upon these findings, the Commission ordered that Golenberg and Adler are barred from association with any broker, dealer, investment adviser, investment company, or municipal securities dealer with a right to reapply after four years and two years, respectively. # **CIVIL PROCEEDINGS**

AVANTI ASSOCIATES ENJOINED

The Commission announced that on April 25 U.S. District Judge Paul G. Rosenblatt entered a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction by Default against Avanti Associates First Mortgage Fund 84 Limited Partnership of Phoenix, Arizona. The Final Judgment enjoins Avanti from violations of the antifraud and filing provisions application to issuers. (SEC v. Avanti Associates First Mortgage Fund 84 Limited Partnership, USDC DAZ, Civil 88, 2124 PHX PGR). (LR-12090)

### INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

PIPER JAFFRAY INVESTMENT TRUST INC.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until May 30 to request a hearing on an application filed by Piper Jaffray Investment Trust Inc., American Government Income Fund Inc., American Government Income Portfolio, Inc., and American Government Term Trust Inc. (Funds) and Piper Capital Management Incorporated (collectively, Applicants). The application requests an order permitting the Funds to deposit uninvested cash balances into a single joint account to be used to enter into large repurchase agreements. (Rel. IC-16946 - May 5)

THE ADVANTAGE INCOME OPPORTUNITY FUND

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until May 30 to request a hearing on an application filed by The Advantage Income Opportunity Fund for an order granting an exemption from various provisions of the Investment Company Act and rules to permit Applicant to impose a contingent deferred sales load, to waive the deferred sales charge under certain circumstances, and to permit certain exchange offers. ## HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

ENERGY INITIATIVES, INC.

An order has been issued authorizing a proposal by Energy Initiatives, Inc. (EII), subsidiary of General Public Utilities Corporation, to make capital contributions to Prime Energy Limited Partnership, a New Jersey limited partnership and subsidiary of Elmwood Energy Corporation, directly or indirectly through Elmwood in the aggregate amount of \$3,165,000 in connection with a proposed cogeneration facility to be located in Elmwood Park, New Jersey. THE COLUMBIA GAS SYSTEM, INC.

An order has been issued authorizing The Columbia Gas System, Inc., a registered holding company, and two of its subsidiaries, Columbia Gas Transmission Corporation and Columbia Natural Resources, Inc. (CNR), to enter into a Reorganization Agreement and Plan that provides: (1) for CNR to acquire all of the production, exploration, and other non-transmission properties owned by Transmission in several states, including oil properties, gas properties, and the coal properties; (2) in exchange therefor, CNR will issue common stock to Transmission equal in value to the aggregate net book value of the natural resource properties received from Transmission; and (3) Transmission will then transfer the CNR common stock to Columbia in exchange for its own common stock of an equal aggregate par value for retirement.
