## **COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS**

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FRIEND-OF-THE-COURT BRIEF FILED

Daniel L. Goelzer, General Counsel of the Commission, announced today that the Commission filed a friend-of-the-court brief in the United States Supreme Court in <u>Beneficial Corp. v. Deutschman</u>. The brief, which was filed in response to the Court's request for the government's views, urges the Court to deny certiorari in a case in which the United States Court of Appeals for the Third Circuit held that purchasers of call options may sue the issuer of the underlying common stock, under the antifraud provisions of Commission Rule 10b-5, for fraudulent misrepresentations which affected the price of the options. #### ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

ORDERS IMPOSING REMEDIAL SANCTIONS AGAINST EFFICIENT TRANSFER, INC. AND ROGER G. COLEMAN, SR.

The Commission issued an Order making findings and imposing sanctions against Roger G. Coleman, Sr. and Efficient Transfer, Inc. Coleman is the owner and principal officer of Efficient, a transfer agent registered with the Commission.

The Commission's Order contains findings that: (1) on May 24, 1988, Efficient and Coleman were permanently enjoined from further violations of the transfer agent provisions of the Exchange Act, and that Coleman was enjoined from violating the anitfraud provisions of the Exchange Act [SEC v. Efficient Transfer Inc. and Roger G. Coleman, Sr., U.S.D.C. UT, Civil Action No. 88-C-271W]; and (2) Coleman had wilfully violated the antifraud provisions of the Exchange Act by falsifying shareholder records, and that Coleman and Efficient wilfully violated the transfer agent provisions of the Exchange Act by failing to comply with the turnaround, record retention, examination, books and records, fingerprint, securities safeguard, and lost and stolen securities requirements of the Exchange Act. The Commission ordered, in accord with Offers of Settlement submitted by the respondents, that: (1) Coleman be barred from association with any broker, dealer, investment adviser, investment company, transfer agent, or municipal securities dealer; and (2) Efficient's registration with the Commission be revoked. ## CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

LOUISIANA REAL ESTATE EQUITY, LTD., OTHERS ENJOINED PROM SELLING INVESTMENT CONTRACTS INVOLVING CONDOS

The Atlanta Regional Office announced that on May 10 Judge Frank J. Polozola, U.S. District Court, Middle District of Louisiana, entered permanent injunctions against White Cypress Lakes Development Corporation (WCLD), a Mississippi corporation, White Cypress Lakes Equity Corp. (WCLE) and Action Real Estate Management, Inc. (AREM), Louisiana corporations in Baton Rouge, for violations of registration and antifraud provisions of the Securities Act and the antifraud provisions of the Securities Exchange Act.

The Commission's Complaint alleges that between February 1984 and July 1987, Louisiana Real Estate Equity, Ltd. (LAREEL), AREM and others sold LAREEL investment contracts of about \$65 million involving condominiums to approximately 200 investors and that LAREEL agreed to pay costs and expenses, and repurchase the condominiums, managed by AREM, at profits or no losses. It alleges misrepresentations and omissions of material facts concerning financial condition of the issuer, use of monies, commissions and occupancy rates.

It also alleges that between March 1986 and October 1987 WCLD, WCLE, and others sold investment contracts of WCLD and United Asset Corporation, another defendant, involving lots in recreational development property in Mississippi; that investors were induced to sign notes, sold to financial institutions at discounts; and that defendants made misrepresentations and omissions of material facts including use of funds and financial condition.

WCLD and WCLE consented without admitting or denying allegations. AREM failed to answer; judgment was by default.
