ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

JAMES WARREN HOGUE BARRED

The Commission instituted administrative proceedings, made findings, and imposed remedial sanctions against James Warren Hogue of San Antonio, Texas. Hogue consented to the Order without admitting or denying any of the charges against him. Hogue, as an employee of the investment adviser to a large mutual fund, was found, among other things, to have violated Section 10(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rule 10b-5, as well as Sections 34(a), 34(b), and 37 of the Investment Company Act of 1940, by having caused unauthorized redemptions from the accounts of fund shareholders and by having converted the monies to his own use. The Order bars Hogue from association with any investment adviser, investment company, transfer agent, broker, dealer, or municipal securities dealer in any capacity. (Rel. 34-26905)

PAUL DAVID HERRLINGER SANCTIONED

The Commission instituted public administrative proceedings under Section 203(f) of the Investment Advisers Act of 1940 against Paul David Herrlinger, formerly an associated person of a registered investment adviser in Cincinnati, Ohio. Simultaneously, the Commission accepted Herrlinger's Offer of Settlement. The Commission's Order finds that Herrlinger wilfully violated Section 14(e) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 by his bogus tender offer for the stock of Dayton Hudson Corporation in June 1987. The Order permanently bars Herrlinger from any association with any broker, dealer, investment company, investment adviser, or municipal securities dealer with a right to reapply to become so associated one year after the entry of the Order. Herrlinger undertakes, upon application to re-enter the securities industry, to demon-strate by a certificate from a board certified psychiatrist, that he is mentally stable and competent to understand the laws and regulations pertinent to the securities industry. Upon reentry to the securities industry, Herrlinger shall be limited in his association with any of the above-mentioned registered entities to a supervised capacity for an additional one-year period.

In his Offer of Settlement, Herrlinger consented to the Order without admitting or denying the allegations. (Rel. 34-26906)

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

FINAL JUDGMENT OF PERMANENT INJUNCTION AND DISGORGEMENT ORDER ENTERED AGAINST BROWNSTONE-SMITH SECURITIES CORP. AND MICHAEL L. DONNELLY

The Atlanta Regional and Miami Branch Offices announced that on May 25 U.S. District Judge Jose A. Gonzalez entered a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction against Brownstone-Smith Securities Corp., a registered broker-dealer, and its president, Michael L. Donnelly, of Pompano Beach, Florida. Brownstone-Smith, which has ceased its operations, formerly maintained its office in Fort Lauderdale, Florida. The Final Judgment permanently enjoined defendants from further violating the antifraud and books and records provisions of the securities laws and required them to disgorge profits of \$100,000 by June 9.

The Complaint alleges that between February 1987 and January 1988, defendants (1) sold certain securities at excessive, undisclosed mark-ups over the prevailing market price of the securities; (2) failed to disclose to customers Brownstone-Smith's domination and control of the market for certain securities; and (3) manipulated trading prices of certain securities. It further alleges that Brownstone-Smith, aided and abetted by Donnelly, failed to maintain records indicating the times at which transactions with its customers were ordered or effected. Defendants consented to the Final Judgment without admitting or denying the Complaint's allegations. (SEC v. Brownstone-Smith Securities Corp. and Michael L. Donnelly, Case No. 89-6249-CIV-GONZALEZ, SDFL). (LR-12126)

COMPLAINT NAMES TEN IN CONNECTION WITH FRAUD INVOLVING EARNED CAPITAL CORPORATION

> The Philadelphia Regional Office today filed a Complaint in the U.S. District Court for the Western District of Pennsylvania against Thomas Reilly, Edward Krall, Philip Joyce, Francis Wayhart, Maurice Chotiner, James Chotiner, Edward Zemprelli, Robert Ryan, Nicholas Hrkman, and East Pointe Construction Company, Inc. The Complaint alleges violations and aiding and abetting violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws.

> The Complaint charges that from 1976 to 1986, Reilly, Krall, Joyce, and Wayhart raised at least \$75 million from approximately 2,600 investors through the fraudulent offer and sale of unregistered securities in the form of undivided percentage interests in rental properties developed and managed by Earned Capital Corporation (ECC). Zemprelli, an attorney, and Ryan and Hrkman, both certified public accountants, aided and abetted the scheme. M. Chotiner, J. Chotiner, and others sold the securities on behalf of ECC. It also charges that Reilly misappropriated ECC assets for his personal benefit.

> Without admitting or denying the Complaint's allegations, Krall, Zemprelli, and Ryan consented to permanent injunctions. The Complaint also seeks an accounting and disgorgement from Reilly, East Pointe, Krall, Wayhart, M. Chotiner, and J. Chotiner. (SEC v. Thomas J. Reilly, et al., WDPA, Civil Action No. 89-1310). INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

COWEN FUNDS, INC.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until July 5 to request a hearing on an application filed by Cowen Funds, Inc., Standby Reserve Fund, Inc., Standby Tax-Exempt Reserve Fund, Inc., and Cowen & Co. for an order to permit exchanges of shares of certain Cowen Funds for shares of Standby Reserve and Standby Tax-Exempt Reserve on a basis that may be at other than their respective net asset values at the time of the exchange. DAILY MONEY FUND

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until July 3 to request a hearing on an application filed on behalf of various mutual funds in the Fidelity group of investment companies requesting an order amending an earlier order [Rel. IC-12912, December 21, 1982] in connection with certain securities transactions with affiliated banks. (Rel. IC-16996 - June 9)

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

THE CONNECTICUT LIGHT AND POWER COMPANY

A supplemental order has been issued authorizing a proposal by The Connecticut Light and Power Company (CL&P), subsidiary of Northeast Utilities. By order dated April 11, 1988 [Rel. 35-24622], CL&P was authorized to issue and sell up to \$350 million of first and refunding mortgage bonds, in one or more series, from time-to-time through December 31, 1989 and to use the proceeds of the sale of the bonds, among other things, to pay off up to \$200 million of its short-term debt. CL&P has now been authorized to use the proceeds of the issuance and sale of the bonds to repay up to \$350 million of its short-term debt. (Rel. 35-24900 - June 12)

APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission approved a proposed rule change filed by the National Association of Securities Dealers, Inc. (SR-NASD-89-14) amending Part VI of Schedule C to its By-Laws to establish waiting periods between attempts to pass gualification examinations. (Rel. 34-26909)
