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CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

FINAL JUDGMENT ENTERED AGAINST ALVIN DESHANO

The Los Angeles Regional office announced that, on August 17, U.S. District Judge Edward Rafeedie of the Central District of California entered a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction, Disgorgement and Imposition of Civil Penalties Against Defendant Alvin DeShano. Deshano consented to entry of the judgment without admitting or denying the allegations of the complaint, which alleged that DeShano, who is Director of General Accounting of Carl Karcher Enterprises, Inc., sold Carl Karcher Enterprises, Inc. stock based on inside information. The Final Judgment permanently enjoins DeShano from future violations of Section 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933 and Section 10(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rule 10b-5 thereunder, orders that DeShano pay disgorgement of \$12,386.19, which represents the losses he allegedly avoided in selling the stock while in possession of inside information, and orders that DeShano pay a one-time penalty under the Insider Trading Sanctions Act of 1984 of \$12,386.19. The action is pending with respect to seven remaining defendants. (SEC v. Carl N. Karcher, et al., Civil Action No. 88-02021 ER (Tx) (C.D. CA.)) (LR-12231)

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

LOUISIANA POWER AND LIGHT COMPANY; SYSTEMS FUELS INC.; GENERAL PUBLIC UTILITIES CORPORATION

Notices have been issued giving interested persons until September 18 to request a hearing on a proposal by the following companies filed under Release 35-24945, dated August 25: LOUISIANA POWER AND LIGHT COMPANY (LP&L) - a wholly owned subsidiary of Entergy Corporation, formerly known as Middle South Utilities, Inc., a registered holding company, to sell and leaseback approximately 14% of its undivided ownership interest in Unit 3 of the Waterford Steam Electric Generating Station. During the first five years of the Lease, LP&L will have the option, but will not be required, to provide a letter of credit to the equity participants. By the beginning of the sixth year of the Lease, LP&L will be obligated to provide them either (1) a letter of credit or (2) collateral first mortgage bonds. In addition, during the period of time that a letter of credit is not provided, LP&L will be required to issue a promissory note evidencing LP&L's obligation to pay amounts equivalent to amounts that would have been provided through a letter of credit; <u>SYSTEMS FUELS, INC. (SFI)</u> - a fuel procurement subsidiary company of Louisiana Power & Light Company, Arkansas Power & Light Company, and System Energy Resources, Inc. (collectively, Operating Companies), each an electric public-utility subsidiary company of Entergy Corporation, a registered holding company, and by the Operating Companies. SFI proposes to borrow an aggregate principal amount of up to \$45 million at any one time outstanding under a Revolving Credit Agreement with a bank or banks (Banks) which will be granted a security interest, among other things, in SFI's nuclear materials and services inventory financed under the Credit Agreement and accounts receivable for such inventory. SFI, the Operating Companies and the Banks also propose to enter into a Consent and Agreement acknowledging and consenting to the security interest granted to the Banks in SFI's accounts receivable; and <u>GENERAL PUBLIC UTILITIES CORPORATION (GPU)</u> - a registered holding company, to issue and sell, from time-to-time through December 31, 1995, up to 2,500,000 shares of its common stock, \$2.50 par value, in connection with a diviend reinvestment and stock purchase plan to be adopted by GPU. GPU requests an exception from the competitive bidding requirements of Rule 50 pursuant to Rule 50(a) (5) for its issuance of the common stock.

APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The Commission approved proposed rule changes filed by: <u>The Philadelphia Stock Exchange</u> (SR-PHLX-89-16) to impose allocations restrictions on a specialist unit that loses its registration in a specialty security pursuant to involuntary reallocation or disciplinary proceedings (Rel. 34-27164) and (SR-PHLX-89-05) to require the submission of certain customer and proprietary trading information in an automated format (Rel. 34-17170); <u>The American Stock Exchange</u> (SR-Amex-89-12) to expand Associate Membership privileges to include access to the PER/AMOS sytem (Rel. 34-27169); <u>The Pacific Stock Exchange</u> (SR-PSE-89-15) to clarify the limitations on trading privileges accorded to holders of special memberships (Rel. 34-27171); and <u>The Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board</u> (SR-MSRB-89-4) that revises the examination <u>specifications and a</u> study outline for the Municipal Securities Representative Qualification Examination (Series 52). The effectiveness of the proposed revision will be delayed until January 1, 1990. (Rel. 34-27175).
