ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

WADDELL JENMAR SECURITIES, INC., OTHERS SANCTIONED

The Commission ordered public administrative proceedings against Waddell Jenmar Securities, Inc. (WJS), Waddell Benefit Plans, Inc. (WBP), Guilford T. Waddell (Waddell) and Susan T. Maddry (Maddry). Without admitting or denying the allegations in the Order, respondents consented to the Order Making Findings and Imposing Remedial Sanctions that they willfully violated the antifraud provisions of the Securities Act of 1933, the antifraud and books and records requirements of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and antifraud provisions of the Investment Advisers Act of 1940. The Commission revoked the registrations of WJS as a broker-dealer and investment adviser, and barred Waddell and Maddry from association with any broker, dealer, investment adviser, investment company or municipal securities dealer. CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

WILLIAM E. POHL, INVESTAS, INC. AND WEPEX, INC. PERMANENTLY ENJOINED

The Chicago Regional Office announced that on August 21, U.S. District Judge Carl B. Rubin of the Southern District of Ohio, entered an Order of Permanent Injunction and Other Equitable Relief against William E. Pohl, Investas, Inc. and Wepex, Inc. The Complaint underlying the above injunctive action alleged that, among other things, between 1984 and 1986, Pohl, Wepex and Investas raised at least \$330,000 from 23 Ohio investors in the fraudulent offer and sale of unregistered securities and that Pohl misappropriated the funds from said sales.

The Order, entered upon the consent of the defendants without admitting or denying the underlying allegations, permanently enjoins the defendants from future violations of the antifraud provisions of the federal securities laws. The Order also permanently enjoins Pohl and Wepex from future violations of certain of the books and records provisions of the Investment Advisers Act of 1940. (SEC v. William E. Pohl et al., Civil Action No. C-1-88-1009, December 1, 1988) (LR-12232)

PERMANENT INJUNCTION ENTERED AGAINST PHILIP H. JOYCE

The Philadelphia Regional Office announced that on August 14, U.S. District Judge Gustave Diamond, Western District of Pennsylvania, entered an Order permanently enjoining Philip H. Joyce from violating certain of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws. Joyce, without admitting or denying the facts alleged, consented to the Order.

The Complaint alleged that from 1976 to 1986, Joyce and other defendants raised at least \$57 million from investors through the offer and sale of unregistered securities in the form of undivided percentage interests in rental properties developed and managed by Earned Capital Corporation (ECC). It further alleged that Joyce, a former accountant for ECC, made material misrepresentations and omissions concerning the nature of the investment, the tax consequences of the investment and the risk associated with the investment. (SEC v. Thomas J. Reilly et al., WDPA, Civil Action No. 80-1310) (LR-12233)

WADDELL JENMAR SECURITIES, INC., OTHERS ENJOINED

The Atlanta Regional Office announced that on July 26, Judge Eugene A. Gordon, U.S. District Court for the Middle District Court of North Carolina, entered a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction against Waddell Jenmar Securities, Inc. (WJS), Waddell Benefit Plans, Inc. (WBP), Guilford T. Waddell (Waddell) and Susan T. Maddry (Maddry). In its Complaint, the Commission alleged that defendants WJS, WBP, Waddell and Maddry violated the antifraud provisions of the Securities Act of 1933, the Securities

Exchange Act of 1934 and the Investment Advisers Act of 1940. Also it was alleged that WJS, aided and abetted by the other defendants, violated the books and records provisions of the Exchange Act. Simultaneously, the defendants consented to the entry of the Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction, without admitting or denying the Complaint's allegations. (SEC v. Waddell Jenmar Securities, Inc. et al., Civil Action No. C-89-509-D) (LR-12234)

INJUNCTIVE ACTION FILED AGAINST GERALD A. HORWITZ

The Commission filed an injunctive action on August 31, in the U.S. District Court for the Central District of California, alleging that Gerald A. Horwitz violated Section 10(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rule 10b-5 thereunder in connection with trading in the securities of Ultrasystems, Inc. The Commission alleges the following: on October 22, 1987, at an executive staff meeting, the Chief Executive Officer of Ultrasystems Defense and Space, Inc., told Horwitz and others that: (1) Ultrasystems was in merger negotiations with Hadson Corporation; (2) the information concerning Hadson was "inside information" and should not be discussed with anyone outside the staff meeting; and (3) they should not be involved in any stock transactions. While in possession of this material nonpublic information, Horwitz purchased Ultrasystems stock and recommended to a relative that she buy Ultrasystems stock.

Without admitting or denying the Complaint's allegations, Horwitz consented to the entry of an order permanently enjoining him from violating Section 10(b) and Rule 10b-5, and requiring him to disgorge \$1,696 (his profits and those of his relative) and pay an ITSA penalty in the amount of \$1,386. (SEC v. Gerald A. Horwitz, USDC CDCA, Civil Action No. 89-5208 PJH(Bx)) (LR-12236)

SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

NOTICE OF PROPOSED JOINT INDUSTRY PLAN

The National Association of Securities Dealers, together with the American, Boston, Midwest and Philadelphia Stock Exchanges, filed a proposed Joint Industry Plan on June 21 pursuant to Rules 11Aa3-2 and 11Aa3-1 under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, that would govern the collection, consolidation and dissemination of quotation and transaction information for NASDAQ/National Market System Securities listed on an exchange or traded on an unlisted trading privilege basis. In addition, the Midwest Stock Exchange filed a request to expand the scope of its Interim Plan, as well as the proposed Plan, to cover 100 stocks, and the Boston Stock Exchange filed a request for an exemption from the requirement of Rule 11Aa3-1 relating to market identifiers for transaction reports or last sale data. (Rel. 34-27178)

Publication of the proposal is expected to be made in the $\underline{\text{Federal Register}}$ during the week of August 28.

ACCELERATED APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The Commission approved, on an accelerated basis, proposed rule changes filed by the Chicago Board Options Exchange (SR-CBOE-89-16), Pacific Stock Exchange (SR-PSE-87-21, Amendment No. 5) and Philadelphia Stock Exchange (SR-PHLX-89-46) relating to extension of the market index option escrow receipt pilot program until January 1, 1990. (Rel. 34-27189)

IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Midwest Clearing Corporation filed a proposed rule change which became effective under Section 19(b)(3) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The proposal (SR-MCC-89-10) modifies MCC's Fund/SFRV rules in order to cease processing exchange orders through this service. (Rel. 34-27190)

TEMPORARY APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

Proposed rule changes filed by the <u>National Securities Clearing Corporation</u> (SR-NSCC-87-04), <u>Midwest Clearing Corporation</u> (SR-MCC-87-03), and <u>Stock Clearing Corporation of Philadelphia</u> (SR-SCCP-87-03) have been approved, pursuant to Section 19(b)(2) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, on a temporary basis until December 31, 1990. The proposals permit those clearing agencies to guarantee at an earlier time settlement of member trades in their respective Continuous Net Settlement (CNS) systems and revise the CNS portion of their respective clearing fund formulas to protect against increased risk posed by an earlier guarantee. (Rel. 34-27192)

Publication of an Order approving the proposals is expected to be made in the <u>Federal</u> <u>Register</u> during the week of September 4.

The Commission approved a proposed rule change filed by the <u>Participants Trust Company</u> (SR-PTC-89-02), that will eliminate the right of a receiving <u>participant</u>, acting as an agent, to reverse a transfer when it determines in good faith that its principal may be unable to fulfill its reciprocal obligation. (Rel. 34-27193)

Publication of the approval Order is expected to be made in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of September 11.
