## ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

### SPEAR, LEEDS & KELLOGG CENSURED

The Commission has entered an Order censuring Spear, Leeds & Kellogg of New York, The sanction was based upon findings New York, pursuant to an Offer of Settlement. that Spear, Leeds & Kellogg aided and abetted violations of Section 206 of the Investment Advisers Act of 1940 by failing to ensure, or taking steps reasonably designed to ensure that a registered investment company and its disinterested directors were apprised of the existence and extent of certain financial and other relationships between Spear, Leeds & Kellogg and the investment company's investment adviser at a time when Spear, Leeds & Kellogg was executing brokerage transactions for the investment company at the adviser's direction. This information was necessary in order to enable the directors to properly evaluate the bases upon which the investment adviser directed the investment company's brokerage and the appropriate disclosures to be made to shareholders. The respondent consented to the findings without admitting or denying the allegations in the Order for Proceedings. (Rel. 34-18591)

# INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

### MONEY MARKET INSTRUMENTS TRUST

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until April 23 to request a hearing on an application of Money Market Instruments Trust (Applicant), for an order conditionally exempting Applicant from the provisions of Section 2(a)(41) of the Investment Company Act of 1940 and Rules 2a-4 and 22c-1 thereunder to the extent necessary to permit Applicant's assets to be valued using the amortized cost method of valuation. #### PRUDENTIAL FUNDING CORPORATION

#### THE SOUTHERN COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing The Southern Company, a registered holding company, to issue and sell up to 20,000,000 shares of common stock pursuant to its Dividend Reinvestment and Stock Purchase Plan and up to 2,000,000 shares of common stock pursuant to the System's Employee Savings Plan. #### MISSISSIPPI POWER COMPANY

#### SOUTHWESTERN ELECTRIC POWER COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until April 27 to request a hearing on a proposal by Southwestern Electric Power Company (SWEPCO), subsidiary of Central and South West Corporation, to issue and sell at competitive bidding up to \$75 million of first mortgage bonds. # **SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS**

### NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The following have filed proposed rule change pursuant to Rule 19b-4: The Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board (SR-MSRB-82-3) to amend MSRB Rule G-9 by reducing the time period required for the retention of information concerning unfilled or unallocated orders received by a syndicate or similar account. The time period would be reduced from six years to the final settlement date of the syndicate or account, typically 90 days after sale. (Rel. 34-18599); and The New York Stock Exchange, Inc. (SR-NYSE-82-4) to permit member firms to incorporate customers' consent to lend securities agreements within customers' margin agreements. (Rel. 34-18608)

### APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission has approved a proposed rule change filed pursuant to Rule 19b-4 by the Pacific Stock Exchange, Incorporated (SR-PSE-82-2) to clarify the priority of certain types of orders on the options trading floor and provide for the handling of cancellations of certain orders held by the Order Book Official. (Rel. 34-18600)

## ACCELERATED APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The Commission has approved, on an accelerated basis, proposed rule changes filed by the National Association of Securities Dealers, Inc. (SR-NASD-82-2) to provide procedures for reporting transactions in securities designated as NASDAQ/National Market System Securities. The proposed rule change also authorizes the Board of Governors to require members to report information regarding NASDAQ securities. (Rel. 34-18601); and (SR-NASD-82-4) to permit for a six month period commencing April 1, 1982, the aggregate reporting of national market system securities in specified circumstances. (Rel. 34-18602)

A rule change filed by the National Securities Clearing Corporation (NSCC) pursuant to Rule 19b-4 (SR-NSCC-82-2) has become effective in accordance with Section 19(b)(3)(A) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The proposed rule change would allow NSCC, pursuant to NSCC Rule 11, Section 6, to levy on its participants additional mark-to-the-market payments on their positions in U.S. Steel Holding Company 12-1/2 percent of 1994 debentures. Those debentures are currently trading on a when-issued basis. Rule 11, Section 6 authorizes NSCC to assess additional mark-to-the-market payments if the price of a security issue is volatile. Publication of the proposal is expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of March 29. (Rel. 34-18603)
