AMENDMENT OF RULES GOVERNING DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY

The Commission announced the amendment, effective immediately, of its rules governing delegation of authority to the Regional Administrators with respect to the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The new amendment authorizes Regional Administrators of the Commission to delay certain of the inspections of newly registered broker-dealers required pursuant to Section 15(b)(2)(C) of the Exchange Act. This action applies only to those inspections of newly registered broker-dealers for which such responsibility has not been transferred to self-regulatory organizations pursuant to Rule 15b2-2 under the Exchange Act. PRIMARILY SECURITIES OFFERINGS IN MAY RISE FROM APRIL

Total primary corporate offerings in May 1982 amounted to \$5.0 billion, an increase of \$630 million (14 percent) from April 1982's total of \$4.4 billion, according to figures released today by the Commission's Directorate of Economic and Policy Analysis. Primary offerings for the first five months of 1982 amounted to \$24.9 billion, a decline of \$4.9 billion (16 percent) from the \$29.8 billion of offerings in the first five months of 1981.

According to figures compiled by the Commission's Division of Corporation Finance on filings made in anticipation of offerings, total filings for the first five months of 1982 (1,875) slightly exceed those made in the first five months of 1981 (1,850). Filings by new issuers only (those not previously filing with the Commission), however, declined to 503 in the first five months of 1982 from the 578 of such filings in the first five months of 1981, a decrease of 75 (13 percent). ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

SUCCESS SECURITIES, INC. AND DONALD G. HAUSMANN CITED

Public administrative proceedings have been ordered under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 against Success Securities, Inc. (Registrant), a registered broker-dealer with principal offices in New York City, and its principal, Donald G. Hausmann.

The Order for Public Proceedings alleges that Registrant violated, and Hausmann wilfully aided and abetted violations of, the net capital, customer protection, bookkeeping, financial reporting, supplemental reporting and registration provisions of the Exchange Act.

A hearing will be scheduled to determine whether the allegations against respondents are true, and if so, to decide what, if any, remedial action would be appropriate. (Rel. 34-18860)

SETTLEMENT OF ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS AGAINST DAVID R. CRAIG

Pursuant to an Offer of Settlement submitted by David R. Craig, vice-president, treasurer and secretary of Fox Fire Financial Associates, Inc., a broker-dealer located in Denver, the Commission has entered Findings and Order Imposing Remedial Sanctions to which Craig consented, without admitting or denying the allegations contained therein.

The Order provides for a bar on Craig from association with any broker, dealer, investment adviser or investment company with the provision that Craig may reapply to become reassociated after three years, and that, if such application is granted, for the first year of such reassociation, Craig may become associated only in a non-supervisory, non-proprietary capacity upon a showing that he will be properly supervised.

The Commission's Order was based upon findings that Craig wilfully violated Sections 15(a), 15(b), 15(c) and 17(a) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rules 15c3-1, 15c2-4, 15c3-3, 17a-3, 17a-5, 17a-11, 15b1-1, 15b1-2, 15b3-1, 15b8-1, 15b9-1, 15b10-4 and 15b10-11 promulgated thereunder, and Section 14(a) of the Securities Investor Protection Act of 1970.
