INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

TRINITY LIQUID ASSETS TRUST; PRIME CASH FUND

CONSOLIDATED NATURAL GAS

APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission has approved a proposed rule change filed by American Stock Exchange, Inc. (SR-Amex-82-16) which would amend Amex Rule 300 to provide that the capital contribution of any partner of an Amex member firm cannot be withdrawn sooner than 12 months after it is contributed. NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The American Stock Exchange, Inc. has filed a proposed rule change pursuant to Rule 19b-4 (SR-Amex-82-11) to rescind Amex Rule 319 (minimum compensation for ABC seatholders); amend Amex Rule 342(b) (outside business activities); rescind Article IV, Section 3(a) of the Amex Constitution (salaried market employees); and amend Article IX, Section 6 of the Amex Constitution (Gratuity Fund).
