## **COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS**

#### SUMMARY OF SEC ROUNDTABLES ON MAJOR ISSUES AVAILABLE

The Commission today released a summary of the discussions at the SEC Roundtables on Major Issues on September 5 and 11, 1985. Purpose of the roundtable discussions was to identify and ventilate public policy issues raised by recent developments in the securities industry and the financial markets. The roundtables were comprised of members of the Commission and leading representatives of the business, legal, and financial communities.

The Summary of Proceedings summarizes discussions of the following issues: tender offer regulation; the one share-one vote rule and other issues of corporate governance; the concept of shareholders "renting" their votes, i.e., detaching the vote from their shares and trading it separately; Edgar, the Commission's electronic filing, processing, and dissemination system; problems in, and regulation of, the government securities market; immobilization of securities certificates; currency and interest rate swaps; internationalization of the securities market; market structure issues; high yield bonds; and liability and insurability of accountants and officers and directors.

# **HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES**

#### EASTERN UTILITIES ASSOCIATES

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until February 10 to request a hearing on a proposal by Eastern Utilities Associates (EUA), a registered holding company, and its subsidiary, EUA Service Company, regarding the issuance by the subsidiary of up to an aggregate of \$20 million of notes to banks and EUA outstanding at any one time, capital contributions and/or common stock acquisitions of up to \$5 million by EUA respecting the subsidiary, and the amendment of the intrasystem service contracts. The aggregate amount of the proposed notes, capital contributions, and common stock will at no time exceed \$21 million. #### KINGSPORT POWER COMPANY

#### IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

A rule change filed by the Depository Trust Company has become effective in accordance with Section 19(b)(3)(A) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The proposed rule change (SR-DTC-85-7) revises DTC's procedures to clarify that securities pledged to the Option Clearing Corporation through the Participant Terminal System are pledged under the same terms and conditions and with the same legal effect as pledge data submitted on paper forms. #### ACCELERATED APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission approved, on an accelerated basis, a proposed rule change filed by the American Stock Exchange, Inc. (SR-Amex-86-1) to begin trading options contracts on limited partnership units (Units) issued by Mesa Petroleum Co. Mesa is currently in the process of converting its common stock into the Units. Both the common stock and the Units are currently traded on the New York Stock Exchange. (Rel. 34-22806)

#### . NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board filed the following proposed rule changes: (SR-MSRB-86-4) to amend Board Rule G-12 on uniform practice to require the disclosure on inter-dealer confirmations of the amount of concession, expressed as a percentage of the security's price, on zero coupon, compound interest, and multiplier securities. (Rel. 34-22807); (SR-MSRB-86-1) to amend Rule G-34 on CUSIP numbers. (Rel. 34-22808);

(SR-MSRB-86-3) to interpret MSRB Rule G-17 to prohibit syndicate managers from charging syndicate members for expenses that bear no relation to or otherwise overstate the actual expenses incurred on behalf of the syndicate.
