ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

SANCTIONS IMPOSED AGAINST NORMAN L. VANCE

The Commission instituted administrative proceedings under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 against Norman L. Vance, a Las Vegas stockbroker, and simultaneously accepted Vance's offer of settlement. In that offer, Vance consented to the Commission's Order Instituting Proceedings, Making Findings and Imposing Remedial Sanctions, without admitting or denying the allegations contained therein.

Accordingly, the Commission entered an Order finding that Vance wilfully violated the registration, antifraud and broker-dealer registration provisions and was enjoined from such violations in <u>SEC v. Jack David Solomon and Norman LaVerne Vance</u> [Civ. LV 83-494 HDM, D. Nev., LR-10985]. Further, the Commission ordered that Vance be suspended from association with any broker or dealer, in any capacity other than having an ownership interest in such an entity, for 120 days.

The Commission alleged, among other things, that Vance participated in the fraudulent sale of 8.7 million shares of unregistered stock of Advanced Patent Technology, Inc. from 1975 to 1980. (Rel. 34-22816)

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

TEMPORARY RESTRAINING ORDER ENTERED AGAINST WORLDMASTERS CORPORATION AND CHRISTOS NETELKOS

The Washington Regional Office announced that on January 16, after a hearing, the federal court in Wilmington, Delaware issued a Temporary Restraining Order against Worldmasters Corporation and Christos Netelkos, also known as Frank W. Roland, both of Smyrna, Delaware, enjoining them from violations of the antifraud provisions of the securities laws. The complaint alleges that since September 11, 1985, the defendants offered and sold Worldmasters common stock and warrants following an S-18 Registration Statement filed with the Commission. It is further alleged that the Registration Statement is false and misleading and omits to state that: (1) the three purported principals of Worldmasters are nonexistent; (2) Netelkos has been previously enjoined from further violations of the securities laws in three separate prior actions; and (3) Netelkos is a fugitive from two previously issued arrest warrants in New York and New Jersey.

The court froze all the assets of the defendants and ordered the preservation of Worldmasters' corporate and financial records. A hearing for a preliminary injunction was held on January 27. (SEC v. Worldmasters Corporation and Christos Netelkos, USDC, District of Delaware, Civil Action No. 86-22). (LR-10988)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

MUNICIPAL INVESTMENT TRUST FUND
