## **CIVIL PROCEEDINGS**

CIVIL ACTION FILED AGAINST CHARLES S. OFFER

The Commission filed a complaint on February 24 in the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia seeking to enjoin Charles S. Offer, a former director of Financial Corporation of America (FCA), from violating the antifraud provisions of the Securities Act of 1933 and Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rule 10b-5, and disgorgement. The complaint alleges that Offer sold 29,000 shares of FCA common stock and 700 shares of FCA preferred stock while in possession of material, non-public information concerning FCA's 1984 financial results. The complaint further alleges that Offer purchased 1,000 shares of First Charter Financial Corporation while in possession of material, nonpublic information concerning the proposed acquisition of First Charter by FCA.

Concurrent with the filing of the complaint, Offer, without admitting or denying the complaint's allegations, consented to a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction and Other Relief, enjoining him from violating the above provisions and further ordering him to disgorge \$3,625 in profits from the First Charter transaction. Disgorgement was not sought respecting the FCA trading, due to the fact that Offer cancelled his sales of FCA prior to the receipt of proceeds from the sales. (SEC v. Charles S. ### LONGHORN COMPANIES AND JOHN LANG ENJOINED

The Fort Worth Regional Office announced that on February 5 Judge Wayne E. Alley, U.S. District Court for the Western District of Oklahoma, issued an order of permanent injunction against Longhorn Oil & Gas Company, Longhorn Gas Programs, Inc., Longhorn Petroleum Company and John Lang of Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, now president of Longhorn Oil & Gas. The order permanently enjoins Lang and the Longhorn companies from further violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws. Lang and the Longhorn companies consented to the order without admitting or denying the allegations in the Commission's August 1, 1984 complaint.

The complaint alleged that Lang, then the chief financial officer of the Longhorn companies, violated the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws in the offer and sale of limited partnerships formed to invest in oil and gas properties. The complaint further alleged that in the sales of these interests, Lang and the Longhorn companies misrepresented and omitted to state certain material facts concerning, among other things, the financial condition, production history and the status of oil an gas reserves of the Longhorn companies.

These orders conclude litigation in this case. (SEC v. J.D. Allen, et al., USDC WDOK, CA 84-1938A). (LR-11005)

#### DAVID KEN YOSHINAGA ORDERED TO SHOW CAUSE

The Denver Regional Office announced that on February 5 Chief Judge Sherman G. Fine-silver, U.S. District Court for the District of Colorado, signed an Order to Show Cause against David Ken Yoshinaga.

A hearing has been set for February 27, at which Yoshinaga is ordered to appear and Show Cause why he should not be held in civil contempt for not complying with the Court's April 22, 1985 Order which ordered him to turn over \$933,933.15 to the Commission in connection with an injunctive action entitled SEC v. Investments Mangement Co., Inc., et al., Civil Action No. 84-F-901, LR-10740. (LR-11006)

#### CRITERION BOND FUND
