

## **NOTICE OF COMMISSION MEETINGS**

Following is a schedule of Commission meetings which will be conducted under provisions of the Government in the Sunshine Act. In general, the Commission expects to follow a schedule of holding closed meetings on Tuesdays, and open meetings on Thursday morning. Meetings on Wednesday, and if necessary on Thursday afternoons, will be either open or closed according to the requirements of agenda items under consideration.

Visitors are welcome at all open meetings, insofar as space is available.

Meetings will be held in the Commission Meeting Room, Room 1C30, at the Commission's headquarters building, 450 Fifth Street, NW, Washington, DC. Persons wishing to photograph or videotape Commission meetings must obtain permission in advance from the Secretary of the Commission. Persons wishing to tape record a Commission meeting should notify the Secretary's office 48 hours in advance of the meeting.

#### OPEN MEETING - TUESDAY, JULY 8, 1986 - 1:30 p.m.

The subject matter of the July 8 open meeting will be:

(1) The Commission will consider whether to publish two releases: one announcing the adoption of various proposals which in effect would increase the total asset threshold for registration and reporting purposes under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 from \$3 million to \$5 million; and the other seeking public comment about other crite- 'ria which might be used to govern entry into and exit from the Exchange Act registration and reporting system. (2) Consideration of whether to issue releases: (1) adopting amendments to Rule 3a12-8 under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 that would exempt certain Japanese government securities from the provisions of the Act for purposes of marketing futures contracts on these securities in the United States; and (2) proposing amendments that would permit boards of trade which are not located in the country which issued the designated foreign government securities set forth in the Rule from trading and marketing in the U.S. futures contracts on such securities, so long as the other requirements of the rule are satisfied. (3) Consideration of whether to adopt amendments to Rule 13e-4 and Regulations 14D and 14E providing that: (1) a tender offer must be open to all holders of the class of securities subject to the tender offer; (2) all security holders to whom a tender offer is made must be paid the highest consideration paid to any security holder; (3) a tender offer must remain open for ten business days upon announcement of an increase or decrease in the percentage of securities being sought or consideration offered by the offeror; and (4) withdrawal rights extend throughout the period of the offer and the elimination of additional withdrawal rights upon commencement of a competing bid. #### **CIVIL PROCEEDINGS**

ARMSTRONG GROUP ENJOINED FOR INVESTMENT ADVISER AND BROKER-DEALER VIOLATIONS

> The Atlanta Regional Office announced that on June 26 Chief U.S. District Judge Charles Moye, Northern District of Georgia, issued a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction against Armstrong Group, Inc., Colony Asset Corporation, Kenneth S. Armstrong and Donald P. Clark, all of Atlanta. The Final Judgment enjoins them from acting as investment advisers or broker-dealers unless registered with the Commission. The defendants consented to the permanent injunction without admitting or denying the allegations of the Commission's complaint. (SEC v. Armstrong Group, Inc., et al., USDC NDGA, Civil Action No. C86-796A). (LR-11147)

TOLEDO TECHNOLOGY, INC. ENJOINED

The Commission announced that on June 30 the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia entered a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction against Toledo Technology, Inc. of Irving, Texas. The Judgment restrained and enjoined Toledo from failing to file timely and in proper form accurate and complete periodic reports and Notifications of Late Filing.

In its April 24 complaint, the Commission alleged that Toledo, as part of a continuing course of violative conduct extending over several years, failed to file its Annual Report on Form 10-K for its fiscal year ended September 30, 1985 and its Quarterly Report on Form 10-Q for its fiscal quarter ended December 31, 1985, and failed to file Notifications of Late Filing. Toledo, consenting to the Court's Judgment, admitted that it had failed to file or filed late four Annual and six Quarterly Reports and had failed to file four Notifications of Late Filing. (SEC v.
