CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

COMPLAINT FILED AGAINST DENNIS A. THOMAS, OTHERS

The Chicago Regional Office filed a complaint on November 14 in the U.S. District Court for the District of Nevada seeking a permanent injunction against Dennis A. Thomas, Malcolm Kanan, Thomas F. Stafford, and Harold M. Tracey, and seeking other equitable relief in the form of disgorgement of proceeds received by Thomas and Stafford. The complaint alleges that Thomas and Kanan violated the registration provisions of the Securities Act of 1933, that Thomas, Tracey, and Stafford violated the antifraud provisions of the Securities Act and the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, and that Thomas and Tracey violated the broker-dealer registration provisions of the Exchange Act.

The complaint charges that from January 1, 1982 to April 1984, Thomas raised \$2.2 million from numerous investors through the sale of unregistered securities in four companies. Thomas sold his own unregistered stock in one of the companies through Kanan, his broker at the time. The complaint further alleges that Thomas, Tracey, and Stafford made and caused to be made to investors material misrepresentations and omissions concerning, among other things, the use of proceeds, the profitability of the investment, the risks associated with an investment, and the existence or likelihood of a future public trading market in the issuer's securities. Additionally, the complaint alleges that Thomas and Tracey acted as unregistered brokers. (SEC v. Dennis A. Thomas, et al., Civil Action No. S-86-1093 HDM, filed November 14, 1986). (LR-11301)
