COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

GAR FILER MANUAL ADOPTED

On April 1, the Commission adopted as a procedural rule the EDGAR Filer Manual (Filer Manual), which sets forth the technical formatting requirements governing the preparation and submission of electronic filings through the Electronic Data Gathering, Analysis and Retrieval (EDGAR) system. The Filer Manual will become effective on April 26, 1993, the day that phase-in of mandated electronic filing commences. Compliance with the provisions of the Filer Manual is required in order to assure the timely acceptance and processing of filings made in electronic format. Filers should consult the Filer Manual in conjunction with the Commission's recently adopted rules governing mandated electronic filing when preparing documents for electronic submission (See Release Nos. 33-6977 (February 23, 1993), IC-19284 (February 23, 1993), 35-25746 (February 23, 1993), and 33-6980 (February 23, 1993)). The Filer Manual will be published in the Federal Register. Paper copies also may be obtained at the Commission's Public Reference Room, Mail Stop 1-2, 450 Fifth Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20549. CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

ALLIED CAPITAL, PETER MERCALDI, MARTI BAREN, RAYMOND KLINGENBERG AND ORVILLE SANDBERG

The Commission announced that on February 17, 1993 the U.S. District Court for the District of Colorado entered Final Judgments against defendants Allied Capital Group, Inc., Peter F. Mercaldi, Marti R. Baren, Raymond G. Klingenberg and Orville L. Sandberg in SEC v. Power Securities Corporation, et al., C.A. No. 90-S-1579 (D. Colo.) (Honorable Daniel Sparr). The Court permanently enjoined defendants Allied Capital and Mercaldi from violating Section 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933 and Sections 10(b), 15(b) and 15(c) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, as well as Rules 10b-5, 15b3-1(b) and 15c1-2 promulgated thereunder. The Court permanently enjoined defendants Baren, Klingenberg and Sandberg from violating Section 17(a) of the Securities Act and Sections 10(b) and 15(c) of the Exchange Act, as well as Rules 10b-5 and 15c1-2 promulgated thereunder. The Court ordered each of the five defendants to disgorge all income earned from Power Securities or Allied Capital in 1988, but disgorgement was waived based upon each defendant's demonstrated inability to pay.

In addition to consenting to the entry of Final Judgments against them, Allied Capital, Mercaldi, Baren, Klingenberg and Sandberg also consented to the entry of Commission Orders Instituting Public Administrative Proceedings, Making Findings, and Imposing Remedial Sanctions. Specifically, Allied Capital consented to the permanent revocation of its broker-dealer license and Mercaldi consented to a permanent bar from association with any broker, dealer, investment company, investment adviser or municipal securities dealer. Klingenberg and Sandberg consented to bars with a right to reapply after four years, and Baren consented to a bar with a right to reapply after three years.

Power Securities and Allied Capital were penny stock brokerage firms that ceased operations in 1989. During 1988 and early 1989, Mercaldi was the president of Allied Capital, Baren and Klingenberg owned and managed certain Allied Capital offices in Florida, and Sandberg was the head trader for Power Securities. The Commission alleges in its complaint that all five of these settling defendants participated in fraudulent sales practices on behalf of either Power Securities or Allied Capital, and that additionally Allied Capital, Mercaldi and Sandberg manipulated the market for Art Cards, Inc., a security promoted by Allied Capital and Power Securities in 1988, and charged customers undisclosed excessive markups for numerous securities promoted by Power Securities and Allied Capital. This case is scheduled for trial against the remaining defendants later this year. Securities Exchange Act of 1934 Release Nos. 32060, 32061, 32062, 32063 and 32064 (March 29, 1993). [SEC v. MARTIN BROWNE ENJOINED BY DEFAULT

The Commission announced that on March 24, 1993 the Honorable Jorge A. Solis, U.S. District Judge for the Northern District of Texas, entered a Final Judgment by Default against Martin G. Browne (Browne) of Dallas, Texas enjoining him from future violations of the antifraud provisions of the federal securities laws.

The Commission's complaint filed June 21, 1991 alleges that Browne, who claimed to be a petroleum engineer, prepared a false and misleading engineering report which grossly overstated the value of oil and gas leases and reserves purportedly owned, directly or indirectly, by Cortez International, Ltd. (Cortez), a now defunct penny stock company. The report was disseminated in the promotion of Cortez's stock, and was relied upon in the March 31, 1987 audit of Cortez's financial statement which was incorporated in the company's Form 20-K filing with the Commission. DANIEL DIAZ PERMANENTLY ENJOINED

The Commission announced that on March 24, 1993 the Honorable Ralph W. Nimmons, Jr., U.S. District Judge for the Middle District of Florida, entered a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction (Final Judgment) against Daniel O. Diaz (Diaz) of Springfield, Virginia. Diaz, without admitting or denying the allegations of the Commission's complaint, consented to the entry of this Final Judgment. Diaz was a financial principal and owner of American Wallstreet Securities, Inc. (AWS), a registered broker-dealer which ceased operations in August 1990. The Final Judgment permanently enjoins Diaz from violating the broker-dealer net capital and books and records provisions of the federal securities laws.

The complaint filed on September 25, 1991 alleges that during various periods from at least July 1989 through March 1990 AWS conducted a securities business while failing to maintain the required minimum net capital. AWS, through Diaz and two other AWS principals, concealed the net capital violations by, among other things, maintaining inaccurate books and records, parking securities in a nominee account and by filing false Focus reports with the National Association of Securities Dealers, Inc. and the Commission. INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

NEW YORK LIFE VLI SERIES FUND, INC.

An order has been issued under Section 8(f) of the Investment Company Act declaring that New York Life VLI Series Fund, Inc. has ceased to be an investment company. (Rel. IC-19379 - April 2)

SAGAMORE FUNDS TRUST, ET AL.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until April 27 to request a hearing on an application filed by Sagamore Funds Trust, et al. for a conditional order under Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act exempting applicants from the provisions of Sections 2(a)(32), 2(a)(35), 22(c), and 22(d) of the Act, and Rule 22c-1 thereunder. The order would permit applicants to impose a contingent deferred sales load (CDSL) on certain redemptions of shares, and to waive the CDSL under certain circumstances. (Rel. IC-19380 - April 2)

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

CENTRAL AND SOUTH WEST CORP., ET AL.

An order has been issued authorizing Central and South West Corporation (CSW), a registered holding company, and its nonutility subsidiary company, CSW Energy, Inc. (Energy), to acquire a 50% interest, through subsidiary companies to be formed, in an approximately \$255 million, 272 megawatt cogeneration facility (Project) to be located in Fort Lupton, Colorado. Energy, through Energy Sub, will pay a purchase price of approximately \$79.5 million, payable in installments, for its 50% interest in a partnership which will own and operate the Project. CSW also proposes to enter into other transactions for the financing of the construction of the Project. (Rel. 35-25782)

EASTERN EDISON COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until April 26 to request a hearing on a proposal by Eastern Edison Company (Eastern), a wholly owned electric publicutility subsidiary company of Eastern Utilities Associates, a registered holding company, to engage in financing. Eastern proposes to borrow, on or before December

31, 1994, the proceeds from certain refunding Pollution Control Revenue Bonds (Refunding Bonds) to redeem certain outstanding Pollution Control Revenue Bonds. In order to secure its obligations under the Refunding Bonds, Eastern proposes to issue a series of its first mortgage bonds and issue an irrevocable letter of credit. Eastern also proposes to cause an insurance company to issue a policy guaranteeing payment of the principal of, premium, if any, and interest on the Refunding Bonds. Eastern further proposes to issue and sell through December 31, 1994 \$175 million of unsecured medium-term notes and unsecured notes. (Rel. 35-25783)

UNLISTED TRADING PRIVILEGES SOUGHT

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until April 23 to comment on the application of the <u>Midwest Stock Exchange</u> for unlisted trading privileges in 2 overthe-counter issues. (Rel. 34-32102)

SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The American Stock Exchange filed a proposed rule change (SR-Amex-93-12) to expand the Amex's Post Execution Reporting (PER) system to permit the entry of up to 25,000 shares for eligible market and limit orders for designated Unit Investment Trust Securities. Under the proposal, the Amex's Floor Governors, in consultation with the senior management of the Amex, will be given the authority to determine which Unit Investment Trust(s) should receive the 25,000-share (or any limit not exceeding 25,000 shares) PER eligibility designation. Publication of the proposal is expected in the Federal Register during the week of April 5. (Rel. 34-32103)

The <u>Boston Stock Exchange</u> filed a proposed rule change (SR-BSE-93-03) to adopt a smoking policy for the BSE and to add that policy to its Minor Rule Violation Plan. Publication of the proposal is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of April 5. (Rel. 34-32104)

ACCELERATED APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission granted accelerated approval to a proposed rule change filed by the <u>American Stock Exchange</u> (SR-Amex-93-09) to change the divisor the Amex applies to the Eurotop 100 Index calculation as disseminated by the European Options Exchange from two to ten. Publication of the proposal is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of April 5. (Rel. 34-32105)
