What is a Webinar?

A Webinar is a web-based workshop that allows the sharing of the presenter's computer screen. A Webinar normally requires a third-party host site such as Go-To-Webinar and will almost always require a software download to participant PCs. Webinar audio will be provided via a separate telephone conference or, in some instances, directly through the PC speakers.

How do I join the Webinar when it's time to start?

1. First, locate the e-mail or printout you received with the session access information.

- 2. Click the "Join Webinar" button or enter the web address shown under the text "Click here to join:" into your internet browser's address field. If the presenter has arrived, you will see his/her computer screen.
- 3. For *Webinar audio*, call the telephone conference number provided and enter the Access Code when prompted.

Another way to join a webinar is to navigate to https://www1.gotowebinar.com,

click the Join a Webinar button on the left side of the screen and enter the Webinar ID.

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Why can't I access the Webinar website?

Several agencies maintain firewalls or system configurations that prevent access to certain websites or prevent the download of third-party software. If this is the case, you will need to contact your IT staff to see if they can allow you access. As an alternative, another PC with internet access outside your agencies internet firewall. Some agencies maintain public access computers that may serve this need.

Verify you are using the correct link to the Webinar or Webinar ID as shown in the FAQ <u>How do</u> I join the Webinar when it's time to start?

If you are not sure you have the correct session access information, see "What can I do if I don't receive the session information or e-mail."

What can I do if I didn't receive the session information or e-mail?

Why has the instructor or presenter not yet arrived when it's time to start?

By far, the most common reason for this is the participant's arrival at the **incorrect start time** because they didn't recognize **time-zone differences**. For example, a session showing the date/time of Wednesday, October 7, 2009 9:00 AM - 10:30 AM CDT would start at 8:00 for those in the Eastern time-zone.

Though rare, there have been several sessions where the presenters were unable to access either the host website or phone conference line due to technical difficulties. Out of approximately 60 sessions, we have had to postpone 2 due to facility power failure and 2 others due to our inability to access the phone conference line for the audio portion of the presentation. If this occurs, we will use the e-mail addresses provided at registration to make other arrangements.
