FSIS Notice 08-11

- Received questions concerning in-plant inspection authorities to slow or stop lines.
- PPIA and FMIA authority for inspection to assess whether carcasses are not adulterated and can be passed for human consumption
- PHV or IIC authority to slow and stop lines
- Online IPP authority to stop lines

PHV or IIC AUTHORITIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- ensure that IPP can perform a post-mortem inspection
- slow maximum line speeds when process control of line speeds is not maintained
- document appropriately when line speed reduced
- regularly correlate appropriate Agency standards

PHV or IIC AUTHORITIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- monitor performance of IPP to assure uniformity of inspection procedures and actions
- respond when on-line IPP report potential problems with presentation, sanitary dressing, contamination, and pathology

PHV or IIC AUTHORITIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- Poultry: perform or assign presentation checks according to presentation forms
- Live stock perform or assign verifications
 - to assess line speed process control
 - in conjunction with verification activities to determine establishment's slaughter and sanitary dressing procedures are controlling contamination that may impact IPP's ability to perform proper post-mortem

ONLINE INSPECTION AUTHORITIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- stop the line for safety and health reasons
- notify the PHV or IIC or off-line IPP if they detect trends of increasing contamination, pathology and disease or improper presentation.
- have the authority to stop the line at times needing immediate intervention to prevent the production of adulterated or unwholesome product.

ONLINE INSPECTION AUTHORITIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

 Poultry Example: if numerous birds in a row are presented at the inspection station with excessive contamination or disease conditions or improper presentation, then the PHV or IIC should be notified and the line should be stopped until the immediate situation is corrected.

ONLINE INSPECTION AUTHORITIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

 If the occurrence of affected birds is occasional then the inspector is to direct the establishment helper to "hang back" the carcass without stopping the line

ONLINE INSPECTION AUTHORITIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

 On-line inspectors assigned to a livestock slaughter establishment are to stop the line according to FSIS Directive 6420.2, Verification of Procedures for Control of Fecal Material, Ingesta and Milk in Slaughter Operations. (Part II. 1. A.) and in accordance with FSIS Directive: 6100.2, Post-mortem Livestock Inspection
