




## GMR as Geographic Region

Each state has a state contact librarian within the GMR office. In addition, each of the ten states has a State Representative, selected by its Health Sciences Libraries Association, who facilitates communication between GMR staff and the state health sciences library groups. State Representatives also serve on the Regional Advisory Council (RAC).

## **GMR as Service Provider**

- Outreach: Exhibiting at conferences and meetings; 17 designated Outreach Libraries including the UIC Library of the Health Sciences

- **Consulting:** Project/proposal development, evaluation, emergency preparedness, technology, resource sharing







## National Network of Libraries of Medicine





The mission of the National Network of Libraries of Medicine (NN/LM) is to advance the progress of medicine and improve the public health by providing all U.S. health professionals with equal access to biomedical information and improving the public's access to information to enable them to make informed decisions about their health.

• The Greater Midwest Region (GMR) is comprised of over 1,000 members, which include medical, academic health science, public and other libraries and organizations that have health information as part of their mission.

• NN/LM developed out of the Regional Medical Program, a Great Society initiative of the Lyndon Baines Johnson administration, initially known as the National Library of Medicine Regional Medical Library Program (RMLP).

• NN/LM GMR is one of eight regions under contract with the National Library of Medicine (NLM), National Institutes of Health (NIH), Department of Health and Human Services. The National Network Office (NNO) of NN/LM is located at NLM and oversees the contract.

• Previous names of the GMR include: Midwest Regional Medical Library – MRML (1968); Midwest Medical Library Network (1973); Midwest Health Sciences Library Network -MHSLN (1974); Greater Midwest Regional Medical Library Network - GMRMLN (1983).

• The GMR includes 32 Resource Libraries selected from the Region based on their collections and the special expertise they contribute to improve regional or national programs. Seventeen Outreach Libraries are chosen to assist the GMR with teaching, providing document delivery, conducting outreach projects, exhibiting and/or presenting at community events or meetings.
