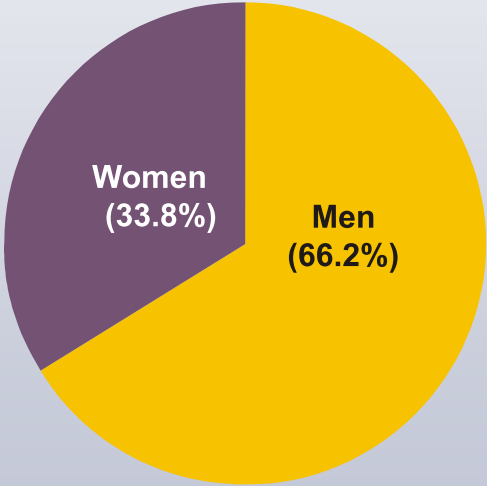
Almost two-thirds of injured or ill workers were men in 2005, well above their 59-percent share of the Nation's hours worked.

Women accounted for more injuries and illnesses than men in management, business, and financial occupations; professional and related occupations; service occupations; sales occupations; and office and administrative support occupations.

Women make up 75 percent of employment in the education and health services industry and account for 79 percent of all injuries.

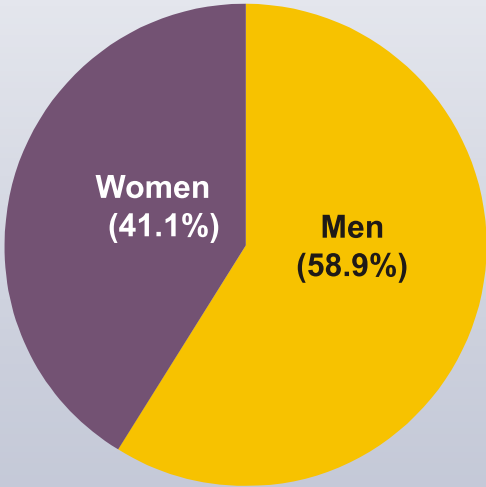


Injuries and illnesses and hours worked, by gender of worker, 2005
