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PHIS Update

FSIS Administrator Al Almanza today conducted a town hall meeting with employees to talk about the Public Health Information System (PHIS).

During the meeting, he discussed lessons learned and the valuable feedback he has received from employees since PHIS was implemented on April 11. Based on that feedback, he announced that the second phase of circuits would be delayed to make necessary improvements.

One of the main challenges, he said, is the uploading of important data and "FSIS is working around the clock to resolve this. For me, the timeline is not as important as getting the job done right."

This delay in implementation for the second wave of circuits means that training will not occur during the month of July, but is expected to resume in August. More information about PHIS may be found at www.fsis.usda.gov/PHIS.
