In 2003, The Kimberley Process Certification Scheme (KPCS), a joint government, international diamond industry and civil society initiative to stem the flow of conflict diamonds was established by the United Nations. The KPCS establishes controls and monitors standards, practices and procedures for its members to enable them to certify shipments of rough diamonds as "conflict-free."

As we approach the ten-year anniversary of the Kimberley Process (KP), the United States of America has been selected as the Chair of the KP for 2012.
