Under the terms of the FY 2012 Appropriation, a 0.189 percent across-the-board rescission is applied to discretionary budget authority available in FY 2012. As a result, all current year discretionary funds are reduced as well as total advance appropriations from FY 2011 available in FY 2012. Advances from FY 2011 are reduced by \$41,403 thousand and amount to a new total of \$21,864,598 thousand. Advance appropriations from FY 2012 available in FY 2013 are not affected by the .189 percent across-the-board rescission, and amount to \$22,597,001 thousand.
