The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) submits the enclosed report on VA's Plan for Periodic Review of Existing Regulations, in response to Executive Order (E.O.) 13563, "Improving Regulation and Regulatory Review," the reporting requirements set forth in Office of Management and Budget (OMB) Memorandum, "Implementation of Retrospective Review Plans," dated October 26, 2011, and the President's recent executive order, "Identifying and Reducing Regulatory Burdens." VA's report continues to follow OMB's suggested template for agency retrospective review plan reports.

VA's mission is to administer benefit programs, provide health care, and perform mortuary services for America's Veterans. Consequently, VA's focus has been on sustaining an ongoing method for identifying, updating, or simplifying significant rules that are obsolete, outdated, confusing, or that place unnecessary burdens on Veterans or their beneficiaries. VA has engaged in several major regulation rewrite projects in the past to accomplish these goals and we will continue to do so in the future. The two major rewrite projects currently in progress that share some of the retrospective review goals of EO 13563 are the Compensation and Pension Regulation Rewrite Project and VA's Schedule for Rating Disabilities Project. Neither retrospective review project is expected to result in significant economic savings, but both retrospective reviews will improve the administration of benefits for veterans. We are monitoring the progress of these major efforts and have deleted all other regulatory actions from our report that were merely updating existing regulations to maintain currency.
