









# Daniel Webster Addressing the United States Senate / In the Great Debate on the Constitution and the Union 1850.







# Acknowledgments

his catalogue documents the Senate's entire collection of graphic art and builds on a 1995 volume by the Office of Senate Curator that illustrated all but the cartoon images then extant in the collection. Since then, more prints have been added to the collection, which now comprises almost one thousand images. A publication such as this could only be possible though the efforts of many individuals. First and foremost, thanks must go to the staff of the Office of Senate Curator. Jamie Arbolino led the project, overseeing the countless details with enthusiasm, humor, and commitment. He worked closely with everyone involved, from the writers to the designer and the printer. He and Theresa Malanum ensured the accuracy of the print data, reviewed each original print, confirmed the proper transcription of information, and conducted the requisite research to correct discrepancies and verify the completeness of each print record. Theresa also developed the extensive artist and sitter index. Amy Elizabeth Burton compiled the bibliography and was responsible for all photographic details, from the scanning of the images to the cropping and placement. Scott M. Strong contributed significantly to the writing, editing, and proofreading, and supervised the printing requirements and specifications. Clare Colgrove Hobson handled the administrative details, providing assistance in countless ways. Richard L. Doerner served as research assistant, fact checker, and proofreader, while Melinda K. Smith, Kelly Steele, and Deborah Wood assisted with review of the galley proofs. All of this work was accomplished in an extremely short time and with a full schedule of other commitments. The staff have my deepest gratitude—it has been a true team effort.

The catalogue was prepared under the direction of Emily J. Reynolds, secretary of the Senate and executive secretary to the Senate Commission on Art. The Office of Senate Curator is indeed indebted to her for her unfailing support, vision, and

constant encouragement on this project and all the work undertaken by the office. She has been indefatigable in her leadership and enthusiasm. Assistant Secretary of the Senate Mary Suit Jones similarly provided sympathetic guidance along the way, understanding the time constraints on the office and the complexities of producing such a publication.

Dr. Donald A. Ritchie, associate historian in the U.S. Senate Historical Office, provided the incisive introductory essay to the cartoon chapter, as well as the illuminating short essays in that section. He has graciously assisted the Curator's Office on innumerable occasions and has always been generous with his time and knowledge. Senate Historian Dr. Richard A. Baker provided guidance and encouragement throughout the project; others in the Historical Office who aided the effort were Assistant Historian Dr. Betty K. Koed and Beth Hahn, historical editor.

Cheri Allen, webmaster, and especially Arin Shapiro, assistant webmaster, worked closely with the Curator's Office to convert the Senate's database information into a publishable document. This proved a challenging task. Adam Bramwell, general counsel for the secretary, coordinated the publication with the Joint Committee on Printing; Zoraida Torres, accounts administrator, handled all financial matters; and Karen Moore, director of Printing and Document Services, helped with the printing specifications and other technical
