## ARLINGTON NATIONAL CEMETERY



**Tour Summary:** Highlights include the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier, the Amphitheater, the Curtis-Lee Mansion, and the graves of Presidents John F. Kennedy and William Howard Taft. **Address:** Arlington National Cemetery in Arlington, VA **Closest Metro Stop:** Arlington Cemetery (Blue Line) **Availability:** Opens at 8 AM every day of the year. From April 1-Sept 30 the cemetery closes at 7PM, the other six months it closes at 5 PM. Changing of the Guard at the Tomb of the

Unknown Soldier occurs each hour on the hour and every half hour in the summer months. **Costs:** Free, but narrated bus tours start from the visitors' center for a cost: Adults \$6.00, Children \$3.00, Seniors \$5.00. The cost of parking is \$1.25/hour for the first three hours, and \$2.00/hour thereafter.

**Costs:** While tickets to the Washington Monument are free of charge, callers to this number will incur a \$1.50 service charge and a \$.50 shipping and handling fee. Visitors may also obtain free, same-day, timed tickets to the Washington Monument at the 15th Street kiosk. Tickets are distributed on a first-come, first-served basis beginning at 8:30 AM until all tickets for that day are gone.

## JEFFERSON MEMORIAL



**Tour Summary:** Honors America's third president. It features a 19-foot bronze statue of Jefferson and inscriptions of passage of the Declaration of Independence and other famous Jefferson writings.

Tour Length: Park rangers give 15-minute talks several times an hour.

#### KOREAN WAR MEMORIAL



**Tour Summary:** Features 19 soldiers arrayed for combat, with the American flag as their symbolic objective. A 164-foot wall is etched with 2,500 photographic images of the support personnel whose efforts sustained the military operation. **Address:** Adjacent to the Lincoln Memorial reflecting pool.

**Closest Metro Stop:** Foggy Bottom/GWU (Blue and Orange Lines) **Availability:** Open 8 AM - 12 midnight. Closed on Christmas.

#### LINCOLN MEMORIAL



**Tour Summary**: Features a 19-foot marble statue of our 16th President, Abraham Lincoln. The memorial also exhibits inscriptions of Lincoln's second Inaugural Address and the Gettysburg Address.

Closest Metro Stop: Foggy Bottom/GWU (Blue and Orange Lines)

# U.S.M.C. WAR MEMORIAL (IWO JIMA MEMORIAL)

## WORLD WAR II MEMORIAL



**Tour Summary**: The National Mall's newest memorial was dedicated to the men and women of World War II – America's Greatest Generation – on May 29, 2004. ## FDR Memorial

#### FORD'S THEATRE AND LINCOLN MUSEUM - closed for renovation until February 2009



**Tour Summary:** Tribute to President Lincoln's love of the arts. Museum includes the clothes Abraham Lincoln wore on the night of his assassination. **Tour Length:** Fifteen minute historical discussions

Address: Located on 10<sup>th</sup> St between E and F streets.

**Availability:** The Lincoln Museum and the house where Lincoln died are open from 8 AM - 11:45 PM every day except Christmas Day. Tours at the theatre are self guided. Talks are presented at fifteen past the house except between 12 noon and 2 PM.

**Costs:** Free. **Notes:** Because Ford's Theatre also functions as an active stage with live performances there are times when the theatre will be closed to the public. Matinees usually take place on Thursday, Saturday and Sunday afternoons, although rehearsals can take place at any time of day. ## HOLOCAUST MEMORIAL MUSEUM



**Tour Summary:** Three floors of history covering from the Nazi's rise to power to the liberation of the troops. **Address:** 14<sup>th</sup> St and Raoul Wallenberg Place in Washington, DC

**Directions:** Public transportation is advised as parking is very limited.

**Availability:** Open daily from 10 AM -5:30 PM except Christmas and Yom Kippur (October 2). Tuesdays and Thursdays April through Mid-June there are extended hours until 7:50 PM. **Restrictions:** Eating, drinking and smoking are not permitted. Video/audio recording are not permitted. Photography is not permitted in the exhibitions.

Flash photography is not permitted in the Hall of Remembrance.

These can be obtained the morning of you visit outside the museum on the day of your visit, or in advance by calling (800) 400-9373. #### INTERNATIONAL SPY MUSEUM

**Costs:** Adult (ages 12-64): \$15, Seniors (65+) and Active Duty Military & Intel Community: \$14, Children (ages 5-11): \$12, Children age 4 and under are free.

**How to Request a Tour:** Groups of 20 or more qualify for Group Admission and require advance reservations which can be made by calling, Group Sales Manager at (202) 654-0944.


Availability: Open every day of the year. April - August 8 AM - 5 PM; March - October 9 AM - 5 PM; November - February 9 AM - 4 PM.


## UNION STATION
