

PART C. UTILITY SERVICES FURNISHED PUBLIC BUILDINGS

57150 AUTHORIZATION

1. Personnel of the Marine Corps may be furnished public quarters, including heat, light, water, and refrigeration. (34 USC 911a).

57151 PUBLIC QUARTERS

1. Public quarters occupied by Army, Air Force, Navy, and Marine Corps personnel will be furnished, at the expense of the Government, a sufficient quantity of fuel and electric current required for heating, lighting, heating water, cooking, and refrigeration. Water for normal domestic use will also be furnished public quarters.

57152 REGULATIONS

1. Commanding officers shall promulgate and enforce necessary post regulations governing the utilization of fuel, water, and electric services in all buildings, including public quarters, to insure that such commodities will be consumed economically. Where neglect, carelessness, or wilful waste of fuel, water, and electric service is apparent, or where rules and regulation governing their utilization have been violated, the commanding officer will take steps to in-

vestigate such violations, and to fix the responsibility for any excess consumption which may have resulted from such neglect, carelessness, wilful waste, or violation, and where appropriate, take disciplinary action.

2. The hours during which exterior and interior lights may be used at a post will be fixed and announced by the commanding officer. The number and wattage of such lights must be limited to the smallest number necessary for proper lighting, and the period of authorized burning of each light must be limited to the necessities of the case, taking into consideration the different seasons. Frequent checks should be made throughout the post to eliminate the use of all unnecessary lights.

57153 UTILITY AND PUBLIC WORKS FACILITIES

1. At all posts and stations where the Marine Corps operates utility and public works facilities that furnish steam, electric current, water, sewage disposal, telephone service and other services to government activities such as naval hospitals, etc., these commodities shall be invoiced to such activities and the unit rate used in invoicing each commodity shall be the "government delivered price".
