SENATE CHAMBER, USE OF CHAMBER

Unanimous consent has been granted to suspend the provisions of the standing rules of the Senate to allow the Majority Leader to use the Senate chamber to respond to the President's State of the Union Address.¹

SENATE CHAMBER—DISPLAY OF CHARTS

There is no Standing Rule that regulates the display of charts, exhibits, etc., on the Senate floor. Rule XVII of the Rules for the Regulation of the Senate Wing of the United States Capitol sets out the guidelines for such displays.¹ Prior to its promulgation, regulation of such displays was managed by the Sergeant at Arms under the precedents and practices of the Senate.²
