UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENT
Richard Stickler (Cal. No. 553)

Ordered, That relative to the cloture motion filed on the nomination of Richard Stickler, of West Virginia, to be Assistant Secretary of Labor for Mine Safety and Health, the mandatory quorum required under Rule XXII be waived.

Ordered, That at 2:30 p.m. on Tuesday, June 13, 2006, there be 60 minutes of debate equally divided prior to the cloture vote on Richard Stickler with 15 minutes under the control of the Senator from West Virginia (Mr. Byrd), 15 minutes under the control of the Senator from Massachusetts (Mr. Kennedy) and 30 minutes under the control of Chairman of the Committee on Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions (Mr. Enzi); provided further, that if cloture is invoked on the nomination, the Senate proceed to an immediate vote on the nomination without any intervening action or debate.
