**UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENT**  
**Jerome A. Holmes (Cal. No. 764)**

*Ordered*, That at 3:00 p.m. on Monday, July 24, 2006, the Senate proceed to executive session for consideration of the nomination of Jerome A. Holmes, of Oklahoma, to be United States Circuit Judge for the Tenth Circuit; provided further, that there be 2 hours equally divided between the Chairman of the Committee on the Judiciary and Ranking Member or their designees to be used on Monday, and another 2 hours equally divided for debate to be used on Tuesday, July 25, 2006.

*Ordered further*, That following the use or yielding back of time the Senate proceed to a vote on the confirmation of the nomination, with no intervening action or debate; provided further, that following that vote the President be immediately notified of the Senate's action and the Senate resume legislative session.
