UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENT

Ordered, That on Thursday, May 9, 2002, at 10:30 a.m., the Senate proceed to executive session to consider en bloc the following nominations:

Leonard E. Davis, of Texas, to be United States District Judge for the Eastern District of Texas (Cal. No. 811);

Andrew S. Hanen, of Texas, to be United States District Judge for the Southern District of Texas (Cal. No. 812);

Samuel H. Mays, Jr., of Tennessee, to be United States District Judge for the Western District of Tennessee (Cal. No. 813);

Thomas M. Rose, of Ohio, to be United States District Judge for the Southern District of Ohio (Cal. No. 814); that there be one hour divided equally between the Chairman of the Committee on the Judiciary (Mr. Leahy) and the Ranking Member (Mr. Hatch), or their designees.

Ordered further, That upon the use or yielding back of time, the Senate vote on each nomination; the motions to reconsider be laid on the table; the President be notified immediately of the Senate's action; that all of the preceding occur without intervening action or debate; and the Senate return to legislative session.
