UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENTS

Ordered, That at 12 noon on Monday, November 18, 2002, the Senate proceed to executive session to consider the nomination of Dennis W. Shedd, of South Carolina, to be United States Circuit Judge for the Fourth Circuit (Cal. No. 1178); that there be 6 hours for debate, equally divided between the Chairman of the Committee on the Judiciary (Mr. Leahy) and the Ranking Member (Mr. Hatch); or their designees; that at the conclusion, or yielding back of time, but not before 5:15 p.m., the Senate vote on cloture on the nomination; that if cloture is invoked the Senate then vote immediately on confirmation of the nomination; that if the nomination is confirmed, the motion to reconsider be laid on the table; the President be immediately notified of the Senate's action and the Senate return to legislative session.

Ordered further, That if cloture is not invoked the nomination be returned to the calendar and the Senate return to legislative session; and that the preceding all occur without any intervening action or debate.

Ordered further, That the granting of this consent fulfills the cloture filing requirement under Rule XXII.

Ordered, That the cloture vote scheduled for November 18, 2002, on the nomination of Dennis W. Shedd, of South Carolina, to be United States Circuit Judge for the Fourth Circuit (Cal. No. 1178) be vitiated; following debate, the nomination be laid aside and that upon the disposition of H.R. 5005, the Homeland Defense bill, the Senate proceed to executive session, and vote, without any intervening action or debate, on confirmation of Dennis Shedd to be a U.S. Circuit Judge.

Ordered further, That if the nomination is confirmed, the motion to reconsider be laid on the table; the President be immediately notified of the Senate's action and the Senate return to legislative session.
