UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENT [MICHAEL CHERTOFF (C. 10)]

Ordered, That at 12:00 noon, on Monday, February 14, 2005, the Senate proceed to executive session to consider the nomination of Michael Chertoff, of New Jersey, to be Secretary of Homeland Security; that the nomination be debated for up to 6 hours with the time equally divided between the Majority and the Minority; provided further, that of the Minority's time 2 hours be allocated to the Senator from Michigan (Mr. Levin) and 20 minutes to the Senator from Connecticut (Mr. Dodd).

Ordered further, That at 2:15 pm on Tuesday, February 15, 2005, the Senate resume debate on the nomination with the time prior to 4 p.m. equally divided; with the Senate to vote on the nomination at 4 p.m.; provided further, that the President be immediately notified of the Senate's action and the Senate then return to legislative session.
