UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENTS

(WILLIAM H. PRYOR, JR. [CAL. NO. 100])

Ordered, That at 4:00 p.m. on Thursday, June 9, 2005, the vote occur on the confirmation of the nomination of William H. Pryor, Jr., of Alabama, to be United States Circuit Judge for the Eleventh Circuit and that the time for consideration be divided as follows: from 10 a.m. to 10:30 a.m. under the control of the Majority Leader or his designee; from 10:30 a.m. to 11 a.m. under the control of the Democratic Leader or his designee; provided further, that the time rotate in the above order until the hour of 3 p.m.; that the time from 3 p.m. to 3:15 p.m. be under the control of the Majority; 3:15 p.m. to 3:30 p.m. under the control of the Minority; 3:30 p.m. to 3:45 p.m. under the control of the Democratic Leader, and finally the time from 3:45 to 4 p.m. be under the control of the Majority Leader.

Ordered further, That following the vote the President be immediately notified of the Senate's action.

Ordered, That following the vote on William H. Pryor, the Senate proceed to consideration of the following nominations of the U. S. Circuit Judges for the Sixth Circuit under the orders of May 24, 2005:

Richard A. Griffin , of Michigan, to be United States Circuit Judge for the Sixth Circuit; and David W. McKeague, of Michigan, to be United States Circuit Judge for the Sixth Circuit.

Ordered further, That the nominations be considered under a total time limitation of 10 hours, equally divided between the Chairman of the Committee on the Judiciary and the Ranking Member or their designees; provided further, that following the use or yielding back of time the Senate proceed to votes on the confirmation of the nominations with no further intervening action or debate; provided further, that following the votes the President be immediately notified of the Senate's action and the Senate then resume legislative session.

Ordered, That at a time determined by the Majority Leader, after consultation with the Democratic Leader the Senate proceed to the consideration of the nomination on the Executive Calendar of Thomas B. Griffith, of Utah, to be United States Circuit Judge for the District of Columbia Circuit; provided further, that there be 4 hours equally divided for debate on the nomination between the Chairman of the Committee on the Judiciary and Ranking Member or their designees; provided further, that following the use or yielding back of time the Senate proceed to a vote on the confirmation of the nomination with no further intervening action or debate; and finally the President be immediately notified of the Senate's action and the Senate then resume legislative session.
