Ordered, That at 5:00 p.m. on Monday, June 28, 2010, the Senate proceed to executive session to consider the nomination of Gary Scott Feinerman, of Illinois, to be United States District Judge for the Northern District of Illinois; with debate until 5:30 p.m., with the time equally divided and controlled between the Senator from Vermont (Mr. Leahy) and the Senator from Alabama (Mr. Sessions), or their designees; that at 5:30 p.m., the Senate return to legislative session to vote on cloture on H.R. 5297; that following the vote, notwithstanding Rule 22, the Senate return to executive session to vote on confirmation of the nomination, that upon confirmation, the motion to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table, the President be immediately notified of the Senate's action, and the Senate resume legislative session.
