#### **UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENTS**

#### The New START Treaty (Cal. No. 7)

Ordered, That on Sunday, December 19, 2010, following remarks by the Leaders, the Senate proceed to executive session to resume consideration of the New START Treaty; that there be 3 hours for debate on Amdt. No. 4839 thereto, divided and controlled, as follows: 1 hour to be controlled by the Senator from Massachusetts (Mr. Kerry), or his designee, and 2 hours to be controlled by the Senator from Idaho (Mr. Risch), or his designee; that no amendment be in order to the amendment; and that, upon conclusion of debate, the Senate vote in relation to the amendment.

#### Raymond Joseph Lohier, Jr. (Cal. No. 892) Carlton W. Reeves (Cal. No. 1092)

Ordered, That, on Sunday, December 19, 2010, following a vote in relation to Amdt. No. 4839, the Senate proceed to consider the nominations of: Raymond Joseph Lohier, Jr., of New York, to be United States Circuit Judge for the Second Circuit, and Carlton W. Reeves, of Mississippi, to be United States District Judge for the Southern District of Mississippi; that the Senate then vote in relation to the nominations; that there be 2 minutes, equally divided and controlled, for debate between Mr. Leahy and Mr. Sessions, or their designees; provided further, that, after the first vote in this sequence, the succeeding votes be 10 minutes each; that, following the votes, motions to reconsider be considered made and laid on the table; that the President be immediately notified of the Senate's action; and that the Senate then resume legislative session.

#### Benita Y. Pearson (Cal. No. 703) William Joseph Martinez (Cal. No. 813)

Ordered, That, at a time to be determined by the Majority Leader, after consultation with the Republican Leader, the Senate proceed to Executive Session to consider the following nominations: Benita Y. Pearson, of Ohio, to be United States District Judge for the Northern District of Ohio, and William Joseph Martinez, of Colorado, to be United States District Judge for the District of Colorado.

Ordered further, That there be a limitation of 60 minutes for debate on each nomination, equally divided and controlled, between the Senator from Vermont (Mr. Leahy) and the Senator from Alabama (Mr. Sessions), or their designees; that, upon conclusion of debate, the Senate vote on confirmation of the nominations in aforementioned order; that there be 2 minutes, equally divided and controlled, for debate between votes; that the second vote be limited to 10 minutes; that, following the votes, motions to reconsider be considered made and laid on the table; that the President be immediately notified of the Senate's actions; and that the Senate then resume legislative session.
