#### **Unanimous Consent Agreement**

Ordered, That the Majority Leader, after consultation with the Minority Leader, may turn to the consideration of Cal. No. 12, The Chemical Weapons Convention.

#### (September 12, 1996)

Ordered, That the Majority Leader, after consultation with the Democratic Leader may proceed to executive session to consider Executive Calendar No. 23, the International Natural Rubber Agreement and that the treaty be considered to have proceeded through all it's parliamentary stages, up to and including the presentation of the Resolution of Ratification and that the committee declaration be deemed agreed to, and that there be 1 hour for debate with 30 minutes under the control of Senator Brown and 30 minutes equally divided between Senators Helm and Pell; further, following the expiration or yielding back of time, the matter be temporarily set aside and a vote occur on the Resolution of Ratification with no intervening action or debate, at a time to be determined by the Majority Leader, after consultation with the Democratic Leader.
