**INSTRUCTIONS  
TO ALL PERSONS OF  
JAPANESE  
ANCESTRY**  
Living in the Following Area:

All that portion of the City of San Francisco, from the intersection of Broadway Street to the intersection of the street which is bounded by Laguna Street, Broadway Street, and the intersection of Broadway Street and the street which is bounded by Laguna Street, in the city of San Francisco.

All Japanese persons, both alien and American, will be removed from the above designated area by 12:00 o'clock noon Pacific, April 2, 1942.

All Japanese persons will be permitted to enter or leave the above designated area 10:00 a. m., Thursday, April 2, 1942, without obtaining special permission from the Bureau of War Relocation at the Civil Control Administration, 2700 Van Ness Avenue, San Francisco, California.

The Civil Control Administration is required to accept the Japanese population affected by this evacuation in the following areas:

1. Other alien and American in the evacuation.
2. Persons employed in support of the evacuation, being alien or other dependents of such kind of persons as teachers, engineers, business and professional employees, health, hospital staff, bank, automobile, etc.
3. Persons required to render assistance for all Japanese in health groups.
4. Transport personnel, such as drivers of passenger or delivery vehicles, and employees in special delivery.

**The Following Instructions Must Be Observed:**

1. A responsible member of each family, preferably the head of the family, or the person in charge of such kind of activities, shall remain in the evacuation area until the evacuation is complete. This person shall be known as the "Evacuation Area Head" and shall be responsible for the evacuation of the family. 2. Evacuation must carry with them in duplicate for the War Relocation Authority the following property:
  - (a) Money and items for each member of the family.
  - (b) Title records for each member of the family.
  - (c) Personal belongings for each member of the family.
  - (d) All other personal effects for each member of the family.

All items carried will be searched, packaged, and placed under seal with the name of the owner and number of packages in duplicate for the War Relocation Authority. The name and number of packages in duplicate for the War Relocation Authority will be placed in the evacuation area. No unattended items are described in paragraph 1, Public Proclamation No. 1, Department of War, Western Defense Command and Fourth Army, dated March 28, 1942, will be carried.

The United States Government through its agencies will provide for the storage of the safe side of the evacuation of the most substantial household items, such as refrigerators, washing machines, stoves and other large household cooking utensils and other small items will be accepted if stored, packed and placed under seal with the name and address of the owner. This safe side will be used for a year.

1. Each family and individual being evacuated will be furnished transportation in the War Relocation Authority. The cost of transportation will be paid by the War Relocation Authority.

On the Civil Control Bureau of 1000 Van Ness Avenue, San Francisco, California between 12:00 a. m. and 1:00 p. m., Thursday, April 2, 1942, or between 8:00 a. m. and 1:00 p. m., Friday, April 3, 1942, to receive further instructions.
