Scope and Content Note

The records of the Poushkin Society in America span the years 1931-1955. The collection chronicles the society's efforts to promote and celebrate the Russian poet Aleksandr Sergeevich Pushkin. The collection is arranged in four series: <u>General Correspondence</u>, <u>Subject File</u>, <u>Printed Matter</u>, and <u>Index to *Boris Godunov*</u>.

The <u>General Correspondence</u> consists of incoming and outgoing correspondence relating to society events, publications, and other interests. The <u>Subject File</u> includes material relating to anniversary celebrations by the society, which included celebrations for Pushkin, Mikhail Íuévich Lermontov, and Nikolai Vasil'evich Gogol; bylaws, minutes, and other material relating to the history and organization of the society; and photographs. The <u>printed matter</u>, consisting primarily of newsclippings also includes pamphlets and booklets relating to Pushkin and Russian literature. A Russian language <u>index</u> to Pushkin's *Boris Godunov* comprises the final series.

Correspondents include Audrey Auinoff, Boris Brasol, Serge Obolensky, N.A. Pushkin, Sergei Rachmaninoff, M. I. Rostovťsev, Igor Ivan Sikorsky, Pitirim Aleksandrovich Sorokin, and George Vernadsky.
