Scope and Content Note

The poems of Horace Callaway Carlisle (1871-) consist of undated and unpublished poems by Carlisle. Carlisle is described in one of his published works, *Poems of Purpose* (Baltimore, 1915), as a poet who recorded his thoughts while a school teacher in Alabama and a resident of the District of Columbia.
